## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

**An Oregon Shipwreck.**  
 DRAIN, Or., Nov. 21.—The tug Fearless, of Coos bay, Captain James Hill commanding, ran on to North Spit, at the mouth of the Umpqua river Tuesday evening, and soon went to pieces, not one of the crew or the passengers escaping. The general impression of seafaring men is that she had sprung a leak, and that the captain was attempting to get into the river in order to save the lives of those on board, and either miscalculated his position or was blown out of his course by the heavy wind prevailing at the time. The number lots is said to be from ten to fifteen souls.

**Gambling Houses Closed.**  
 SPOKANE FALLS, Nov. 21.—This evening all gambling was stopped by order of the new district attorney, Dutch Jake's famous resort was the first closed, there being fully 1000 men in the place at the time. No arrests were made, the gamblers being simply ordered by the sheriff to close.

**Dom Pedro Wanted It.**  
 LONDON, Nov. 21.—The story is current in certain quarters that Dom Pedro, of Brazil, was himself the prime mover in his own deposition. He had endeavored to resist his son in law's active hostility to the anti clerical party, and had other reasons to be dissatisfied with him. Further more, his majesty was by no means ignorant of the popular movement. He felt that if he should outlive the republican advance his daughter would be unable to cope with it, more particularly under the pernicious guidance of her husband.

**After Speed.**  
 ST. PAUL, Nov. 21.—The successful inauguration of the Union Pacific's new fast train has not, as yet, had a perceptible effect upon the Northern Pacific, and it is a question whether it will, for the present at least. The Union Pacific had a train out of Portland Sunday, which made the run to Chicago in precisely three. The Northern Pacific time is four days. There is no question about the latter being able to make as fast, if not better time than the Union Pacific, but it is a question whether it is advisable to inaugurate such fast service at this time of the year.

 SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 21.—The sporting editor of the Daily Illustrated World to-night sent the following dispatch to John L. Sullivan "Am authorized by the San Jose Athletic Association to offer \$15,000 for a finish fight with Peter Jackson. Respond," John L. at first refused to accept the offer, but later reconsidered his decision, and said he would fight Jackson in San Francisco for a \$15,000 purse.
