

A Very Big Fire.

LYNN, Mass,, Nov. 26 .- Lynn, the city of noes, was visited this afternoon by the greatshoes, was visited this afternoon by the great-est fire in its history, and, with two exceptions the conflagration is the most disastrous that ever visited New England. The fire started about noon, raged over eight hours, devastat-ed a squire mile of the business section of the city, and caused a loss estimated at \$10,000,-000. In fact the greater part of Ward Four is wiped out, as regards the important shoe manufacturing blocks and prominent place of business.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 26 .- The trial of the suit brought by Charles Frankenthal against the Southern Pacific Railroad Company to recover \$50,097 was begun to-day. He boarded the train at Oakland and had gone as far on his journey as Suisum, between here and Saciamento, when the cenductor, after exantining the tieket for which he had paid \$97.50, put the same in his pocket and forcibly ejected the plaintiff from the car because plaintiff would not sign his name to the ticket as requested to by the conductor.




