TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

The California Flood.

CHICO, Cal., Dec. 12.—The Sacramento river near here is still overflowing. Great masses of debris are piled against the bridge, and the last report from there says the entire structure has gone. The levees are broken near Durham and the surrounding country flooded. Barney Linn, while attempting to remove his wife and four children in a small boat, was caught in the current. The boat was swamped and two children, a boy and a girl, drowned. The others escaped.

A Prohibition Brewer.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—It is intimated that Judge Brewer, recently appointed justice of the supreme court of the United States, will not have an easy time in securing a position on the bench. Strong opposition has been developed to his confirmation on the part of the Iowa liquor men, his opponents basing their fight upon the decision of Brewer that Kansas breweries could be confiscated by the state without reimbursing the brewers. It is believed, however, that Brewer will be confirmed eventually.

An Eastern Blizzard.

ST PAUL, Dec. 12.—The signal service observer reports a cold wave approaching from the north. It is more than 1000 miles wide. This evening at 8 o'clock all the territory north of Montana, Dakota and most of Minnesota had a temperature from 2 to 14 degrees below zero.

At Medicine Hat the mercury stood this evening at 16 degrees below zero; at Prince Albert, 14 below; Minnesota, 10 below; St Vincent, 6 below. The barometer is very high to the northward, and that is evidence that the wave will be of considerable duration.

Seattle's Growth.

SEATTLE, Dec. 12.—The increase in the business of the mail-carrier system since its establishment in Seattle is one of the best evidences of the city's marvelous growth. During the entire month of October, 1888, the total number of letters delivered by carriers was 4916. Last Monday the twelve carriers on Seattle's mail routes, delivered 9378 letters. During the month of November just past, there were 356,335 pieces of mail delivered to residents and collected for transmission. This included 149,200 letters, 9173 postal cards, 84,011 papers and circulars and 1178 registered letters delivered and 88,995 mail letters 5812 local letters, 5566 local postal cards, 5342 mail postal cards and 7068 papers and packages collected.

Dazzled Incandescent Lights.

McMINNVILLE, Or., Dec. 12.—To-night the town is enjoying the brilliancy of the electric light. Great interest is taken in the display. People wander about in groups looking at the different lights. The streets are lit up in every direction, and stores, shops and offices are all lighted up. The pumps for water works are also running. Everything seems to be a grand success, and the town believes itself up with any of its modern neighbors.
