TWO WAYS TO A WRONG.

There is some surprise and a good deal of indignation felt throughout the country at the unconcealed purpose of the Republicans in Congress to strengthen their majority in the House by the simple process of unseating seventeen of the Democrats whom the people have elected, and seating in their stead seventeen Republicans whom the people have not elected.

The indignation is natural and just. But the surprise is scarcely called for, inasmuch as it is the declared purpose of the same Republicans in Congress to enact a law this Winter which shall enable them hereafter to create what majority they please for their side of the house by the similar process of giving the certificates of election in the first place to defeated Republican candidates instead of letting the elected Democrats enter the House for a time.

Mr Henry Cabot Lodge's scheme for a Federal supervision of elections means precisely that. Its plan and purpose are to set aside narrow Democratic majorities by Federal authority where they cannot be overcome by Federal intimidation.

The two things are identical in moral character and effect; but the unseating of men elected is a more public and risky process than the control and perversion of elections. The one creates a National scandal, the other is local in its shame. The Federal election law is intended to spare the Administration party the necessity of working its iniquities in the full light of day.

### Postal Allowances.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17.—Representative Hermann to-day made application to the department for clerical allowance to various fourth class postoffices in Oregon, among them being Hepper, in Morrow county, Hillsboro, in Washington county, Grant, in Sherman county, and Cottage Grove in Lane county.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 18.—The president has transmitted the following nominations to the senate: Andrew M Crawford, receiver of public moneys at Roseburg, Or.

### Why Not Albany Too.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 17.—A dispatch was received here to-day from M M Estee, delegate to the Pan American congress, stating that the delegates to the conference will visit the Pacific coast at the close of the session. The delegates will come by way of the Southern Pacific, and it is understood they will also visit Seattle, Portland, Tacoma and Los Angeles.

### A Timber Claim Swindler.

SPOKANE FALLS, Dec. 17.—A Deaver was arrested this evening on telegraphic instructions from Tacoma. Deaver had opened an office here and advertised that he would give \$300 for timber claim rights. The scheme was to take \$25 cash and agree to pay \$150 in sixty days and the balance sixty days later. It is hardly necessary to say Deaver never met the first notes.

### After the Surplus.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 17.—An Examiner special from Washington says: Senator Stanford will soon introduce a bill providing for the erection of a postoffice in every town where for three years past the receipts have been \$3000 or more; the buildings to cost from \$15,000 to \$30,000.

### Served Him Right.

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo., Dec. 17.—The coroner's jury to-day returned a verdict of justifiable homicide in the case of Miss Epperson, who yesterday shot and killed Julius Hoffer, her father's farmhand. It developed at the inquest that Hoffer had endeavored to criminally assault the girl, and only desisted when the other hands came to dinner. Then it was that Miss Epperson got a revolver and killed him.
