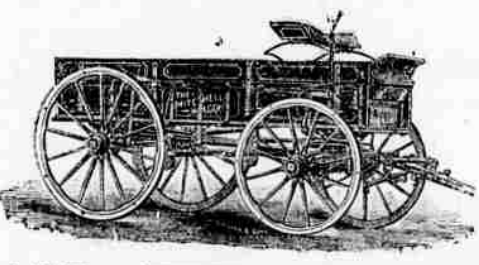

**Business Failures in 1889.**  
 NEW YORK, Dec. 30.—Bradstreet's reports 11,719 failures in the United States for the year 1889, with liabilities of \$146,359,490, and assets of \$70,599,769. This is the largest number of failures, and greater liabilities than for any year in the past five years. The increase in the number of failures over 1888 is 1132; increase in liabilities, \$20,117,188; increase in assets, \$8,599,858.

**Randall Very Ill.**  
 PITTSBURG, Dec. 30.—A special from Columbus, O., says: Isaac R. Hill, of Washington an intimate friend of Samuel J. Randall, reports the latter very low, and the chances are that he will never resume his seat in the house of representatives.

**Former Linn Co Man.**  
 WALLA WALLA, Dec. 30.—Riley Koontze, aged 74, a pioneer well known here and in the Willamette valley, died here this afternoon. He came to Oregon in 1850.

**Blaine Bro.**  
 SALEM, Dec. 30.—Professor Melville G. Lane (or Blaine,) principal teacher at Chemawa Indian training school, near Salem, and brother of Secretary of State James G. Blaine, died this evening after a brief illness, at the age of 63. He was a man of rare ability, a fine speaker and an able educator. He was tall and spare, resembling the secretary very much as to features. Deceased managed the campaign for James G. Blaine in 1884, and through his influence was recently appointed teacher in the government school.

**Up in Arms.**  
 CHARLESTON, S. C., Dec. 30.—Prominent colored men of Charleston and vicinity have issued a call to the people of South Carolina, reciting the butchery of eight of their race at Barnwell, and calling on colored people to send representatives to a convention to be held at Columbia January 2, for the purpose of consulting and formulating a plan by which the laws can be enforced and order preserved.

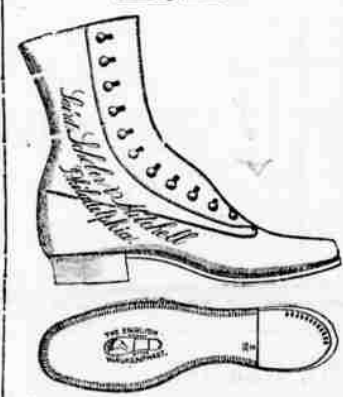
