NEW YORK, Dec. 30 .- Bradstreet's reports 11,719 failures in the United States for the 11,719 failures in the United States for the year 1589, with liabilities of 8146,359,490, and assets of 870,599,769. This is the largest number of failures, and greater liabilities than for any year in the past five years. The in-crease in the number of failures over 1888 is 1132; increase in liabilities, \$20,117,188; in-crease in seets, 88, 50.858. crease in assets, \$8,599,858.
