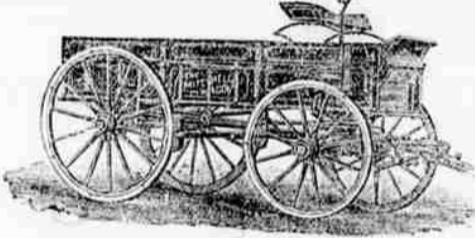

The manufacture of attar of roses furnishes employment to hundreds of persons. A visit to the rose fields is something one will remember a life time. The largest rose fields in the world are at Kezan Lik, in Bulgaria. There the roses from which the perfume is made are cultivated most extensively. The rose district extends for miles and miles, and the entire country is a solid mass of flowers. The district is, I should judge about one thousand square miles. In procuring the attar of roses nothing but the leaves are used. It takes 6,000,000 of leaves to make one pound of the attar. The rose leaves are picked in the proper season, thrown into piles and then taken up and placed in large copper kettles for the purpose of distilling the pure oil or attar. The kettles are arranged one within another and the leaves are taken through twenty five or thirty distillations. Good attar of roses can be had for from \$12 to \$15 per ounce at wholesale. It sometimes retails for \$50 to \$60 an ounce.

NEW YORK, Jan. 23.—Henry Jackson, former paying teller of the sub-treasury, who ran away to Canada with \$10,000 and who pleaded guilty to a charge of embezzlement a few days ago, was today sentenced to six years imprisonment and a fine of \$10,000, the amount he embezzled.

Ex Senator Riddleberger Dead.
WISCONSIN, Jan. 24.—Ex-Senator Riddleberger died at 2:30 o'clock this morning.

[Harrison H. Riddleberger was born in Edinburgh, Shenandoah county, Virginia, Oct. 4, 1814; received a common school education. In 1851, while commonwealth's attorney and state senator, he was elected to the United States senate as a road-jester, in the place of John W. Johnson, conservative, and took his seat December 3, 1853. His term of service expired March 3, 1859, since which time he had not been in public life.]

Wholesale Chicken Thieves.
CENTRALIA, Jan. 24.—Henry Symonds and Al Ayer were caught at Toledo, yesterday, with forty five chickens in their possession, which they had stolen from Centralia and neighboring farms. Marshal Blackwell brought them to Centralia, where they were tried today and fined \$40 each.
