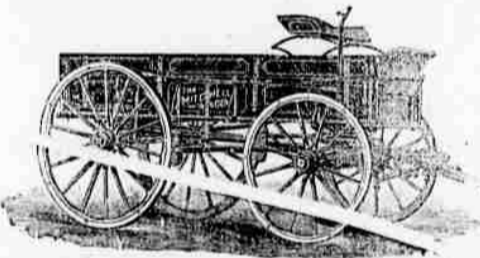

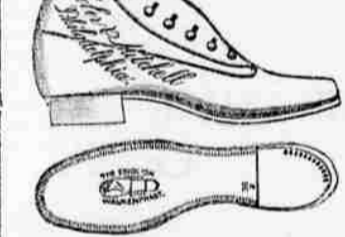

Bad rules would be better than none, as a constitution and laws, are always better than an arbitrary despotism. Yet the country never has long sustained a Congressional majority that abused its power.

An Old Tramp.
SALEM, Jan. 30.—The body of an old tramp was found along side the narrow gauge, near Aumsville, yesterday. The coroner's jury today returned a verdict finding that death had resulted from a tree falling on him while asleep, mashing his head flat, after which his clothes took fire from the campfire and burned off entirely, roasting the body. The man's identity is unknown. He was about 60 years old. Henry Keene, justice of the peace, conducted the inquest.

Slow Work.
SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 30.—Southern Pacific officials were greatly relieved this afternoon when the telegraph announced that the long imprisoned trains were making a general advance towards San Francisco. The truck of picking the ice from the rails between Truckee and tunnel 13, on the eastern slope of the Sierras, was completed this forenoon.

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
