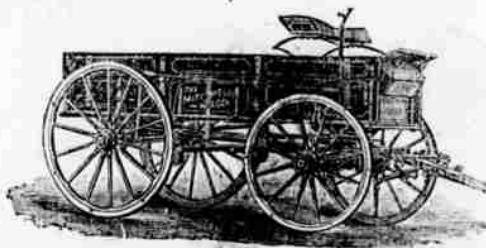

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Washington News.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12.—In executive session the senate confirmed the nomination of Morgan to be commissioner of Indian affairs—28 votes in the affirmative, 16 negative. Two republicans, Ingalls and Pierce, voted against confirmation.

Nearly fifteen hundred persons were in the galleries this evening to listen to arguments upon the proposed code of rules Mansur, Lunge Rogers, Springer, Snipley, Wike, Brookshire, and Pierce denounced the rulings of the speaker while they were defended by Moore, Dannel, Houck, and Joe Taylor, of Ohio.

The senate unanimously passed a resolution congratulating the people of Brazil on the formation of a republican form of government. The committee on territories decided to report favorably Delegate Carly's bill for the admission of Wyoming as a state.

The Assessors do Meet.

PORTLAND, Feb. 12.—In response to the call by Governor Pennoyer upon the assessors of the various counties of the state to meet in convention to confer upon the subject of an equal system of taxation throughout Oregon, the following county assessors met to day at the court house: George Bareman, Baker county; John W Noble, Clackamas; Henry W Deane, Columbia; Charles Timm, Grant; J J McGee, Morrow; George Harold, Multnomah; B A Marquis, Umatilla; D Guild, Union; Hugh Goudry, Wasco; J J Kurath, Washington; F M York, Yamhill; C C Myers, Sherman. An organization was effected but no business of importance was transacted by the convention. Adjourned until to-morrow.

Terrible Eruptions.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 12.—The steamer Gaelic arrived from Hong Kong and Yokohama last night.

Japanese advices gives details of one of the most terrible volcanic eruptions in the recent history of Japan. Mount Zou, near the town of Tukuyama, Ingo district, commenced to rumble on the evening of January 16th. The inhabitants of the neighboring villages fled. Then the top of the mountain was lifted off, and there was a din equal to a dynamite explosion. Sandstones were belched forth covering the surrounding country a foot deep. No previous eruption of Mount Zou is recorded. One life was lost and fifty houses destroyed. The total loss is estimated at three and a half million dollars.

Ashland to Mott.

SISSON, Cal., Feb. 12.—A train started from Ashland, Oregon, to Mott, Cal., this morning to run every other day. Mott is one hundred miles south of Ashland. The situation is unchanged in the canyon from Densmore to Mott. 150 men passed here to-night to work on the Cow creek section.

Terrible Loss of Cattle.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 12.—J C Nother, of Eureka, Nevada, who is in this city, states that in traversing eighty odd miles of road from Eureka to Palisade he saw the carcasses of about two hundred cattle. He says he had heard of the loss of thousands, and that he considered the statements well authenticated. He believed that the losses of cattlemen would be over seventy five per cent in the state.

From Linkville.

LINKVILLE, Or., Feb. 11.—The telegraph lines from here to Ashland are now working, after being down one month.

More snow has fallen this winter than any time since the country was settled by white men.

One life was lost during the storm, Mrs H E Spencer was crushed beneath the falling beams of her house on January 24th, and instantly killed. The accident was caused by the heavy weight of snow crushing the house.
