

Edited by Albany, W. C. T. U.

At the W. C. T. U. Annual meeting on Tuesday of last week a large attendance of members was present, including Mrs. M. J. Townsend, late of Portland, and for seven years president of the Albany Union. Reports of officers showed an energetic and faithful prosecution of the work for the past year. The Secretary's report showed that twenty-three regular meetings have been held, with an average attendance of twelve, and each meeting full of interest. Seven new members have been received. Total amount of money received, \$477.90; amount paid out on order, \$564.81, including \$300 paid on indebtedness on Hall, and \$50 and upwards for building a kitchen, and \$40 insurance.

A very complete and encouraging report from Mrs. O. S. Pollock, Superintendent of Young Women's work, was read by the Secretary. The report shows a gain of twenty-three in membership, quite a number of whom are young gentlemen honorary members. Four socially successful entertainments have been given by the Y's, who also conducted the program for the Thanksgiving social of the mother union. Hopeful results may be expected from these ninety-eight brave young hearts pledged to and under training for the temperance work.

Mrs. L. E. Blain reported favorable progress in her department of juvenile work. Mrs. M. C. Pike has been appointed Superintendent of Kindergarten work, and will present the methods and merits of her department at the parlor meeting at Mrs. S. J. Baltimore's on Friday afternoon, April 11th.

Mrs. St. John, agent for Union Signal, reported 46 copies of the paper taken.

Elizabeth Harrison, principal of the Chicago Kindergarten training school, in discussing "The Root of the Temperance Question from a Kindergarten Standpoint," relates the following suggestive incident: "I know of a kindergarten-trained five year old son of a millionaire, who refused spiced pickles when they were passed to him at the table. 'Why, my son,' said his father, 'do you not want some pickle? It is very nice.' 'No,' replied the boy, 'I don't see any use in eating spiced pickle. It don't help to make me strong; my teacher says it don't.' If this kind of training can be carried out, such a boy will grow into the young man who, when tempted, can easily say, 'No, I see no use in that. It will not help to make me a stronger or better man.'"
