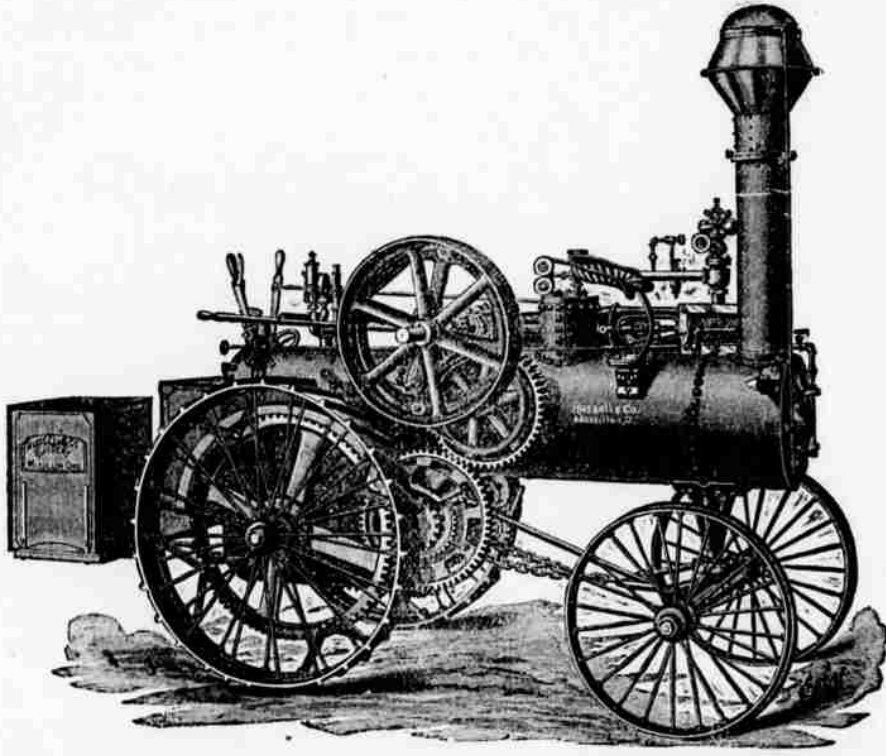

CONFIDENT DEMOCRACY.

Chairman Goldsmith Claims Penoyer Will Be Elected.

Chairman E Goldsmith, of the democratic state central committee, is not a whit terrified by the cheerful and sweeping claims of the republican managers as to the outcome of the coming campaign. Replying to a questioning reporter yesterday, he said:

"I believe that we shall elect most if not all of our candidates on the state ticket, our nominees for the legislature from this county, and many of the county officers. In this city many who never vote for a democrat will now vote for many of the candidates on our ticket. The merchants and mechanics are almost solid for governor Penoyer and for others on our state and county tickets."

"In the rural districts Governor Penoyer will receive the solid democratic vote, and large numbers of republicans will vote for him, not for political reasons, but because they are well pleased with his administration. They have watched it and found it to be a clean and honest one, and have always found their governor on the side of the people on any and all questions where the people's rights and the welfare of the state were involved."

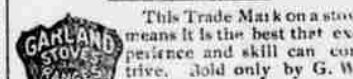
"Our only danger is that our opponents may make use of large amounts of money with the floating and purchasable population. I have confidence, however, in the better class of the people of this state, and cannot bring myself to believe that the purchasable vote of the state is large enough to overcome a decisive majority of the honest voters."

"Moreover, we shall not sleep in this matter. If we can bring home to anyone bribery or the purchase of votes we will make it exceedingly warm for the parties concerned in it. We are perfectly content to leave the decision to the legitimate voters of the state, as they shall honestly express by their ballots, but do not propose to allow the purchasable vote to decide it if we can prevent it."

"What will you say, Mr Goldsmith, about the cry of free trade, which is urged against your party?"

"My understanding of democratic doctrine, and of our state platform, is that there is nothing of free trade except in the charges of the republicans. That issue is ought to be forced upon us. Opposition upon the tariff question is plainly enough stated in the platform, and we are ready to face the issue upon its declarations. We do not want free trade, but a proper and much needed revision and reduction of the existing tariff."

It is the intention of the committee to make a very active and thorough canvass all over the state. It was not the original intention of Governor Penoyer to make many speeches, but there has been such a demand to hear and see him, chiefly through the correspondence of the county committeemen, that has arranged the schedule as published yesterday. Other requests for the governor's presence are still coming in, but the engagements already made will tax him to the utmost.—Oregonian

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

A Bad Fire.

UTICA, N. Y., May 8.—The larger portion of Chenango county buildings, located at Preston, near Norwich, burned at midnight last night, and ten inmates, possibly more, were burned. The buildings destroyed were the asylum, in which were about eighty inmates, and the pauper house and idiot ward, in which were forty inmates. Both were three story wooden buildings in good repair, having wings of two stories in height. They were valued at \$25,000; insured for \$19,000 and area total loss. The horrible part of the disaster was the burning of ten idiots, who were pinned in their cells and roasted alive. The origin of the fire was probably scattered sparks from a slight fire which occurred Wednesday afternoon.

Live Astoria News.

ASTORIA, May 8.—The long deadlock between the salmon fishermen and cannery and of the Columbia river ended today by the action of leading cannery men in agreeing to pay \$1 apiece for fish. They had previously offered 75 cents and the Fishermen's union demanded \$1 25. Tuesday the union reduced its price to \$1.

To-night Samuel Elmore, the largest cannery on the river, advertised that he will pay \$1. Others promise to follow suit.

Astoria subscribed \$200,000 in twenty four hours as the subsidy for C P Huntington, who agrees to build from Astoria to a connection within the main line of the Southern Pacific within two years.

Base Ball Overdone.

NEW YORK, May 8.—Spalding, of Chicago; Hawley, of Cleveland, and O'Neill, of Pittsburgh, held a long secret conference here yesterday. They decline to state the result, but it is known that the ball season, both of the League and Brotherhood, has not been successful financially so far, and it is believed that a number of clubs in both associations will have to go to the wall unless something can be done to improve the situation.

Chinese News.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 8.—A Chronicle Los Angeles special says: What has long been expected transpired about 8 o'clock this evening. The two warring factions of Chinatown came together and the result was a riot. One Chinaman was shot and killed, one was seriously wounded, and a white bystander was shot in the leg.

Carlisle a Candidate.

LEXINGTON, May 8.—Ex Speaker Carlisle has declared his candidacy for the seat made vacant by the death of Senator Beck. In company with friends he went to Frankfort today to present his claims to the legislature now in session.

A Suicide.

SALEM, May 8.—John H Jory, an old pioneer living out in the Red hills, six miles south of town, took an overdose of morphine this morning at 11 o'clock, with suicidal intentions. He had been physically and mentally wrecked for some time. He can not recover. He was an old and respected citizen. He came to Oregon from Illinois in 1847, and has lived here ever since, and leaves a widow, five children and four brothers here.
