

## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS A Bad Fire,

UTICA, N Y., May 8 .- The larger portion of Chenango county buildings, located at Pres-ton, near Norwich, burned at midnight last night, and ten inmates, possibly more, were night, and ten inmates, possibly more, were burned. The buildings destroyed were the asylum, in which were about eighty inmates, and the papper house and idiot ward, in which were forty inmates. Both were three story wooden building in good repair, having wings of two stories in hight, They were valued at \$25,000; insued for \$19,000 and are a total loss. The horrible part of the disaster was the burn-ing of ten idiots, who were penned in their cells and roasted alive. The origin of the fire was probably smouldering sparks from a slight fire which occurred v claesday afternoon.
