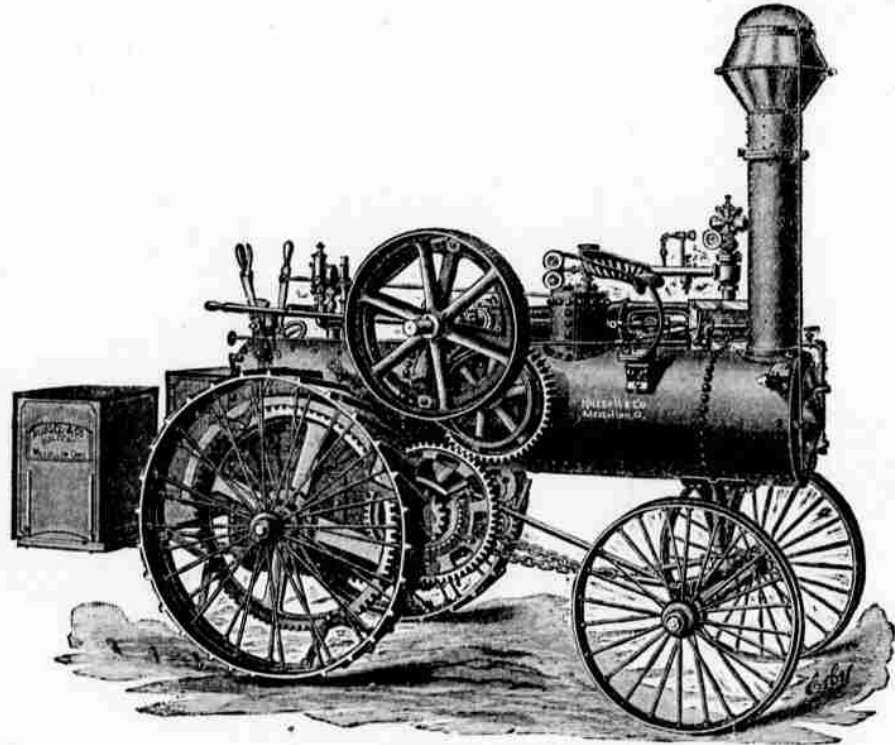

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

The River and Harbor Bill. WASHINGTON, May 14.—Considerable opposition is being developed to the river and harbor bill, but there is no probability that it will be put off until the next session, as suggested in some reports, but it will probably be taken up as soon as the tariff bill is out of the way. The delegation from Washington is not altogether satisfied with the bill and will make a strong fight to amend it in the senate, even at the expense of Oregon.

The White Caps. MERIDIAN, Miss., May 14.—A band of "white caps" who have been unmercifully beating parties in this neighborhood, visited the house of a negro named Anderson, last Sunday night. Upon the negro's refusal to come out, they fired the house. Anderson then ran out and fired into the crowd, killing Louis Land and wounding two others. Anderson escaped.

A Deep Cut. CHICAGO, May 14.—The Burlington road announced that next Saturday the rate to St. Paul from Chicago will be reduced to \$3. The present rate is \$8. The cut will be generally met.

This afternoon the Milwaukee & St. Paul retaliated on the Burlington by making a \$3 rate between Chicago and Council Bluffs, Omaha and Kansas City, and \$5 to Sioux City, as well as making the cut to St. Paul.

Anything for an Excuse. SEATTLE, May 14.—The employes of the Mechanic's Mill Company to the number of 150 went out on a strike at 2 o'clock this afternoon. The Mechanic's Mill Company runs a saw and planing mill down on the mud flats and employs about 200 men. Its pay roll amounts to about \$15,000 per month. The strike was brought about by a question of the time of pay.

Carlisle Ahead. FRANKFORT, Ky., May 15.—The democratic caucus to night took four ballots. Only six names were voted upon, Carlisle, McCreery, Lindsay, Knott, Moore, Settle. Messrs Buckner, McKenzie and Reeves were left out entirely. The fourth ballot stood: Carlisle 39, a gain of 5 over the first ballot; McCreery 12, a gain of 2; Lindsay 28, Knott 16, Moore 12, Settle 7. Carlisle is undoubtedly stronger tonight, and his men are in a mood to push the contest to a close to-morrow.

The Proper Thing. SAN FRANCISCO, May 14.—The Southern Pacific company is about to build extensive repairs on its snowsheds in the mountains, which are made necessary by the damage done by the heavy snow storms of last winter. The sheds will be thoroughly braced and put in first class condition before the coming winter.

A Big Judgement. NEW YORK, May 14.—The sum of \$271,750 was awarded by the decision of Judge Wallace, of the United States court, against the Chemical National Bank at Cincinnati. The claim was for balance due on collateral for an unpaid loan.
