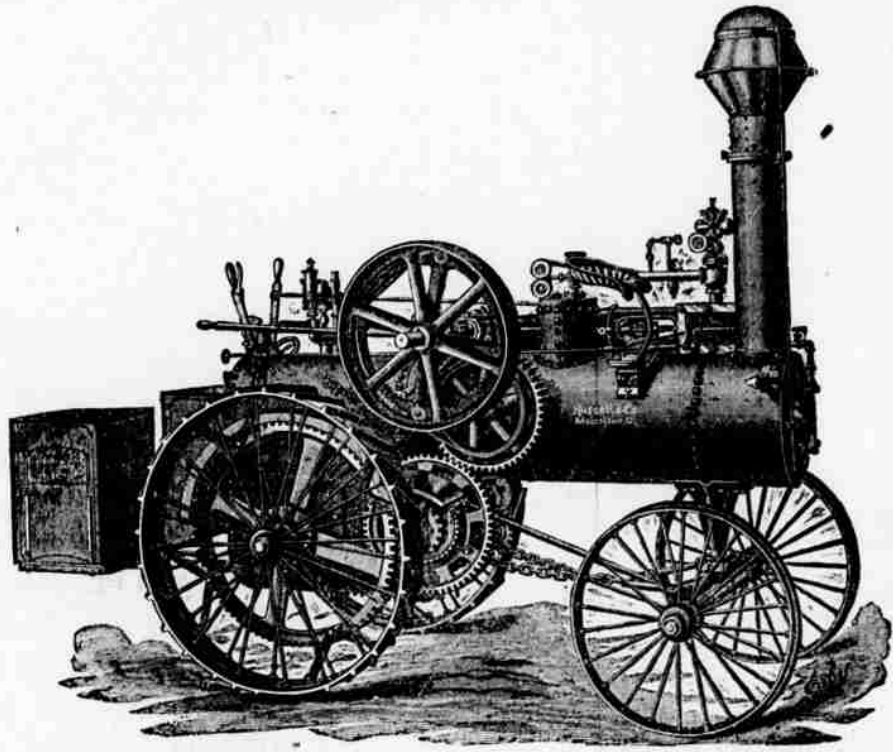

### TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

#### How it Happened.

CORVALLIS, Or., May 20.—Minnie Wyatt, wife of Frank Wyatt, a well to do young farmer, living near Plaloth, committed suicide this morning. She had prepared breakfast and called her husband who stepping out of the house a few moments, heard the report of a pistol. Rushing into the house, he found his wife on the floor with a bullet hole in her head and the pistol lying beside her. The young couple had been married but a few months. Mrs Wyatt had been unwell for some time and it is supposed she committed the rash act while laboring under temporary insanity.

#### California Floods.

STOCKTON, Cal., May 20.—The warm weather has raised the water in the San Joaquin and Sacramento rivers so the island levees are now in greater danger than at any previous time this year. This morning the east and west levees, seven miles long, were again threatened, water from an old river coming within one foot of the top, and the waves wash badly.

#### A Big Fall.

SEATTLE, May 20.—At 3:30 o'clock this afternoon, two large three story brick buildings in the course of construction at the corner of South Third and Washington streets, fell in with a crash, both complete wrecks. The buildings were being erected by Brodeck and Siesinger and Nugent and by J H Sanderson. The first named was 90x108 and the other 108x35. They were built upon made land and twenty foot piles were driven for foundations.

#### Hotels in Line.

CHICAGO, May 20.—The three hotels where the strikes occurred yesterday, the Palmer, Tremont and Commercial, are running very short handed to-day. The Grand Pacific hotel signed the scale of the Culinary Alliance last evening and the Auditorium signed this afternoon. Hotel help are in sympathy with the striking waiters at the Tremont.

#### Warmed Matters.

JACKSONVILLE, May 20.—Governor Pennoyer and State Treasurer Webb spoke here this evening to a large house. The governor spoke in his usual vein and was frequently applauded. Political matters are warming up here.

#### Randall's Successor.

PHILADELPHIA, May 20.—Richard Vaux was elected to congress from the Third congressional district to day, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Samuel J Randall. There was practically no opposition.

#### A Fashionable Man.

KANSAS CITY, May 20.—City Treasurer Peake was suspended from office this evening, a shortage between \$17,000 and \$20,000 having been discovered in his accounts.
