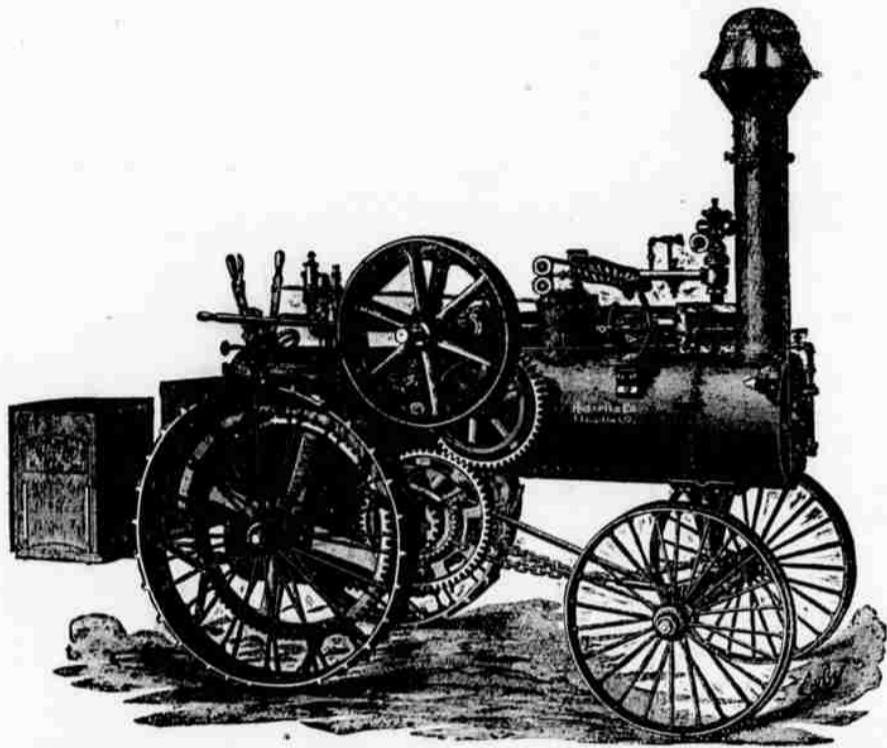

#### TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

#### An Eastern Storm.

BALTIMORE, June 1.—Dispatches from various towns in Virginia tell of terrible wind, hail and electric storms. Numbers of barns were struck by lightning and many animals were killed. The storms also extended over the line in West Virginia. At Warrenton the Baptist church was violated. The storm was accompanied by a violent deluge of hail and hardly a whole place can be found on the north side of houses of glass and Winchester streets. At Summit Hill, W. Va., two frame churches and a half dozen houses were blown down, several persons injured and miles of farm land devastated.

#### A Beer Monopoly.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 1.—The Chronicle says to day's mail brought the legal documents consummating the sale of local breweries to an English syndicate for \$7,500,000. The new corporation will be known as "The San Francisco Breweries."

#### An European.

SOPIA, June 1.—The northern part of this city has been wrecked by a hurricane. The loss of life is considerable. Among the soldiers the killed and wounded numbered eleven. The loss among the inhabitants is not yet ascertained. The damage to the palace amounts to \$300,000.

#### The Wonderful Billiards.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 1.—The billiard contest between Schaefer and McClary closed last night. Schaefer scored another run of 3000 points, which made a continuous run of 3000 points for three nights. McClary had no opportunity to use the cue after the first night, when he scored fifteen points. The score at the close was: Schaefer, 3004; McClary, 15.

#### They Got Mad.

CINCINNATI, June 1.—The grand council of the United Commercial Travelers Association yesterday adopted a resolution demanding of President Harrison, in the name of \$25,000 traveling men, the removal of John A. #### Again Looming Up.

The Astoria Columbian sums up the amount of real estate sales in Clatsop Co. for the week ending May 17th at \$29,053. The Astoria real estate market is showing a decided improvement since Hurlington expressed his intention of completing the Astoria & South Coast road into Astoria. The sales reported above were not large, but better than they have been for the past two months. The city is brightening up, and the big boom, which precedes railroad building in the Northwest has already commenced in Astoria. The bonding of property during the week named reached a quarter of a million dollars, but the amount deposited on these bonds hardly reached \$30,000, they proving that the actual transfer totals were not a reflex of the condition of the market. The lots held by the Oregon Land Co. of Salem and Portland, in the North Pacific addition to Astoria, are again coming in demand and offer a very desirable investment.
