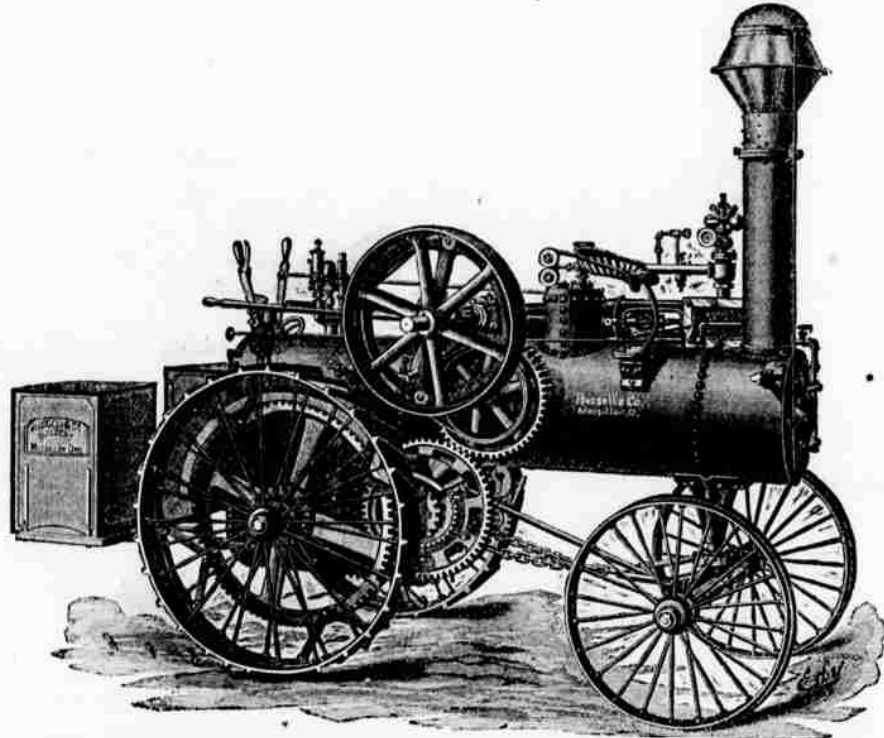

### TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

**A Big Robbery.**

SAN FRANCISCO, June 6.—Upon examinations made of certain portions of the walls of the new city hall, the result shows that walls, supposed to be of solid brick, four feet in thickness, were found in places to be filled in with rubble mortar, sand, broken fragments of brick and other rubbish. It is estimated that 1,500,000 bricks were not put in according to contract. The loss to the city is about \$40,000. Further investigations are to be made.

**A Brutal Outrage.**

BELGRADE, June 6.—The recent attack of the Arnauts on a Servian village on the frontier, proves to have been an unprovoked and brutal outrage. The inhabitants were driven out of their houses in the dead of night by a false alarm of fire, for the purpose of murdering them. Out of a population of one hundred, fifteen were killed, thirty-five were wounded.

**Committed Suicide.**

BUTTE, Mont., June 6.—W. P. Pixley committed suicide at his home on lower Main street. His wife and a daughter, aged 16, sell beer at the Comique Theater. They came home early in the morning and found Mr. Pixley intoxicated, with a pistol in his pocket, and using threatening language. They took refuge at a neighbor's house, where they slept till noon to-day, when they again sought their home and were horrified to find the husband and father dead on the floor with a bullet hole through his left temple.

**Was Hanged.**

PORTLAND, May 6.—"Pellio" the Indian convicted of the murder of a half-breed woman on the Umatilla reservation, and sentenced Jan 30th, was hanged here to-day by the Federal authorities, assisted by county officers. The execution took place in a wood shed of the county jail. After facing those present he spoke about ten minutes in Chinook, which was interpreted by deputy sheriff Misser, saying that God knew he was innocent; that he did not kill the woman and God knew he spoke the truth.

**An Oregon Commissioner.**

EUGENE, Or., June 6.—Hon. M. Wilkins, of this county, to-day received his commission, as United States Commissioner from Oregon to World's fair. He expects to go to Chicago in a short time to attend the meeting of the commissioners.
