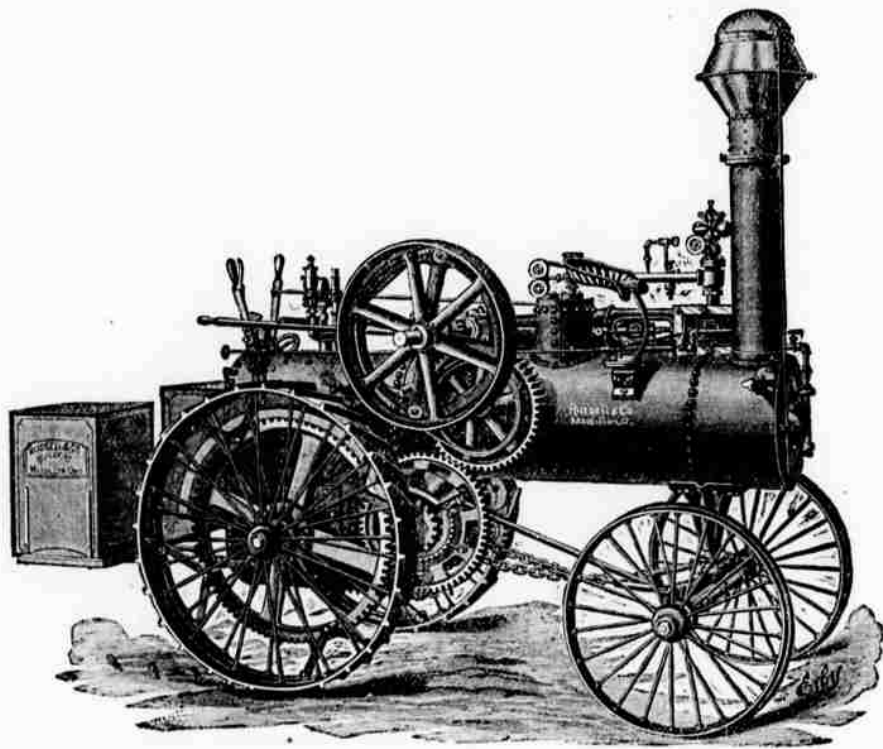

### TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

#### Charge of Bribery.

OLYMPIA, June 10.—The Olympia Tribune of this afternoon makes the startling announcement that a charge of attempt at bribery was laid before the members of the state board of education in session this afternoon, in the shape of a check for \$5000 given one of the members for the purpose of moving a reconsideration. This plain documentary evidence fell like a bomb shell in the board. It was a reflection on at least two other members of the board, because such a large amount of money would not have been given to one member to make the motion unless those who accepted the bribery were sure of two others. A third member would have made a majority, the board being composed of five members. The exposure was made by L H Leach, of Vancouver, secretary of the board.

#### A Trunk Suit.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 10.—M Wunsch & Co., filed suit this morning in the United States circuit court against the Northern Pacific Railroad Company to recover the sum of \$21,874. The complaint alleges that on March 24, I P Eisenbach, a traveling man for Wunsch & Co, took a ticket from Spokane Falls for Missoula, checking at the same time a trunk valued at the sum prayed for. Eisenbach received a check for the transportation of the trunk, paying excess baggage therefor. On the way to Missoula the train was wrecked and the trunk partially burned. The drummer hauled the remains of his sample trunk from the wreck, and purchasing a new trunk, placed the jewelry in it, showed it to the conductor, and it was agreed that the same should be delivered to him at Missoula on presentation of his baggage check for the old trunk. Instead of doing this it is claimed that Conductor Crandall sent the trunk through to St Paul, Minn., and it has never been returned to him.

#### An Indian Spring.

HELENA, June 10.—Authoritative reports come in from the vicinity of the Cheyenne agency that the bucks have left their regular camps and are gathering in small camps of from fifteen to twenty five, in the timber, and are acting in a most insolent manner to settlers firing at houses and making the most threatening demonstrations. So alarming were the reports to-day that Col. El Swaine, commanding at Fort Keogh, telegraphed to the department headquarters, and this evening a party was received ordering him to send one troop of cavalry and two companies of infantry to the Cheyenne agency.

#### At Princeton.

PRINCETON, N J., June 10.—This morning the twentieth annual games occurred, in which three records were broken, 100 yards being run in even time, 220 yards in 23 1/2 seconds, by Cary; and a shot being put thirty two feet and five inches by Janeway.

#### Almost a Fire.

SILVERTON, June 10.—Yesterday about 2 o'clock the fire bell was rung, and it was soon discovered that the Commercial hotel was on fire. The fire company and citizens responded to the call, and soon the hotel was alive with busy men and women, endeavoring to subdue the flames, which they accomplished in a short time.
