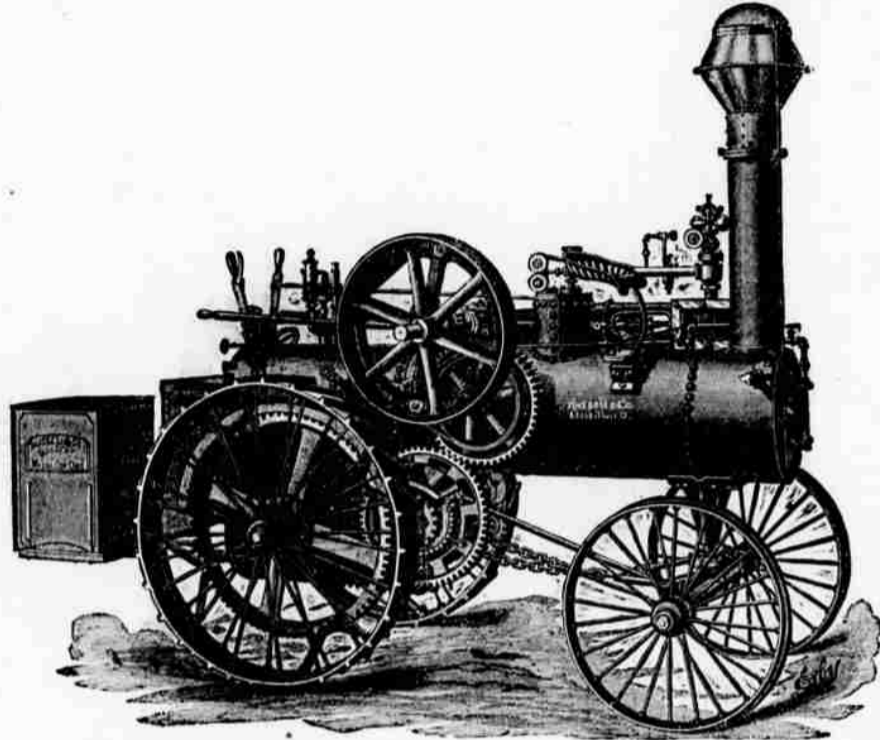

HINTS TO HOUSEKEEPERS.

Jewelry can be beautifully cleaned by washing in soap suds, in which a few drops of spirits of ammonia are stirred, shaking off the water and laying in a box of dry sawdust. This method leaves no marks or scratches.

Women who wish to preserve the beauty and contour of their figure must begin by learning to stand well, says an authority on the subject. That is explained to mean the throwing forward and upward of the chest, the flattening of the back, with the shoulder blades held in their proper places, and definite curving in the small of the back, thus throwing the whole weight of the body upon the hips.

Gloves should never be rolled into a wad or left lying outside. Pull off slowly and stretch each finger to its full length. Mend every minute rip with glove thread and needles, which come especially for the purpose. Wrap each pair in tissue paper, and keep in a long box, without folding.

After carpets are relaid go over them and wipe with a damp cloth wrung out of warm water, to which ox-gall or ox-gall soap has been added. If this cannot be obtained use spirits of turpentine in the proportion of two tablespoonfuls to a gallon of water. Ammonia should not be used, as it is sometimes injurious to delicate colors.

To mend a very large hole in socks or woven underwear, tack a piece of strong net over the aperture and darn over it. Thus mended the garment will be stronger than when new, and look far neater than if darned in the ordinary way.

In families where there are small children it is not enough to have vials containing poisons labelled distinctly. They ought always to be kept in a different place from other liquids, and if possible in a bottle especially shaped, with exterior roughness, so that even in the dark the dangerous character of the contents may be recognized.

Wine, mildew or ink stains on delicate fabrics can be dipped in clear cold water, and then in a mixture made by one tablespoonful lemon juice, one tablespoonful oxalic acid and one-half pint rain-water, shaken together. Green spots can usually be taken out by covering the spots with French chalk scraped on, covered with brown paper, and a warm flatiron set on it to cool.

The diameter of trees varies not only from Summer to Winter, but from day to day. They are larger from noon until twilight next morning than from twilight to noon; they are smaller in Winter than in Summer. Water and the sap of trees expand not only in proportion as they rise above, but also as they go below the freezing point. Low temperature as well as high promotes evaporation, and the trees evaporate from their branches in Winter, and so the colder the weather the more they shrink.

The butterfly pumps nectar into itself through a tube, and bees and flies suck up their food with their long tongue or proboscis. The spider's mouth is quite a complicated affair. It has fangs for holding its prey, masticators or organs for bruising its solid food, and a sucking apparatus for taking up the fluids. Quite as complicated is the mouth of the mosquito, which consists of the lances, the saws and the pumping tubes.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

A Cowboy Fight.

DENVER, June 12.—Albuquerque, N. M., special: There was a free fight yesterday among a number of cowboys on the head of the Nigratas, Socovi county, resulting in the death of John and Garret Davis, on one side, and Fred Groslette on the other. This is the second of the Groslette boys who has come to a violent death in that county. Owing to the isolated point where the affray took place, the particulars cannot be given. There are two factions in that county, and it is thought the killing is the result of bad blood and too much bad whisky.

A Union of Roads.

CHICAGO, June 12.—It is practically certain that after the next annual meeting of the Union Pacific the Vanderbilts will be in control, and that president Hughtitt, of the North-western, will be president of the entire Union Pacific Northwestern system. Little by little enough facts have leaked out to demonstrate that the contract between the Union Pacific and Northwestern was a contract by a Vanderbilt with a Vanderbilt, and has been amply a test, which has proved that the two systems can be more economically operated as one.

Strikes Everywhere.

DENVER, Colo., June 12.—Twelve thousand carpenters quit work to day, to sustain 400 machine wood workers and bench mill men who have been out a month demanding nine hours work with ten hours pay. All building operations are suspended at present. Hod carriers and tinners are expected to join the strikers.

A Big Storm.

AUBURN, N. Y., June 12.—The worst rain storm of the season occurred in this city and vicinity to-day. Railroad tracks were washed out, cellars flooded, foundations damaged and crops ruined. In the immediate vicinity of this place the damage will reach \$200,000.

Killed by Hail.

ST. LOUIS, June 12.—At Rolla during the hail storm yesterday, stones four inches in circumference fell, killing Jesse Cox, a farmer, who was literally pounded to death while in the field setting out cabbage plants.
