The city council of Seattle has done itself great credit in rejecting by a vote of five to two, a petition for a license to establish a saloon on the shores of the magnificent Lake Washington, in connection with a variety theater. The Leader, of Seattle, well says concerning this commendable action: "If the voters of Seattle were not blinded by partisan prejudice or the glitter of the blood-stained gold paid into the city treasury by the saloon keepers, the same sound reasons that prevented the establishment of a legalized human slaughter-house on Lake Washington would drive every saloon from the city."

A bright young Chicago worker told a reporter the other day that if he would take the trouble to look around he would see hundreds of women and children "hacking bricks" every day for twelve cents a thousand, and added: "You will probably find their men folks at home rushing the growler, or at some saloon drinking beer, talking strike and damning the country."

Miss Ackerman makes a strong plea to have a white ribbon missionary stationed in Japan and supported by the World's W. C. T. U. She says it is a case of "now or never" with Japan; if the country is held for God and temperance, workers must be stationed and sustained there. Letters from missionaries in Japan speak in high terms of the value of Miss Ackerman's work.

The prohibitory laws of the new territory of Oklahoma have been shamefully violated and the temperance people are organizing for work. A telegram has been sent to the secretary of the interior informing him that the United States revenue officer is openly granting licenses and that the vilest liquor is sold indiscriminately to Indians, drunks and even little children.

If grand ideas had waited for public sentiment, where would be now? In the dim twilight of a tallow dip, instead of this electric light around us; on the old ox team, instead of enjoying the speed and splendor of the Pullman palace car, and on the temperance question back in the custom of the days when a man could advertise the liquor business on the tombstone of his father, as was done when that inscription was made on a tombstone in the country, which comes to us thus: "Here lies below, in hope of Zion, The landlord of the Golden Lion; His son keeps on the business still, Obdient to his country's will."

At the thirteenth annual convention of the United States Brewers' Association in Washington, John W. Mason, commissioner of internal revenue, was introduced by the presiding officer, and said he was glad to be with the brewers, for he regarded them as substantial business men engaged in a lawful and legitimate business. "Having paid your tax to the government," he said, "you are entitled to the privilege of selling beer. It is a mistake for you to think that the government desires to hamper you by unnecessary restrictions." John W. Douglass, one of the commissioners of the District of Columbia, also paid his respects to the convention, and spoke even more flatteringly to these brewers. His speech so pleased these brewers that one of them remarked, "We haven't much to fear for Washington if we can keep Douglass on this line." Yet these men are Federal office holders.—Union Signal.
