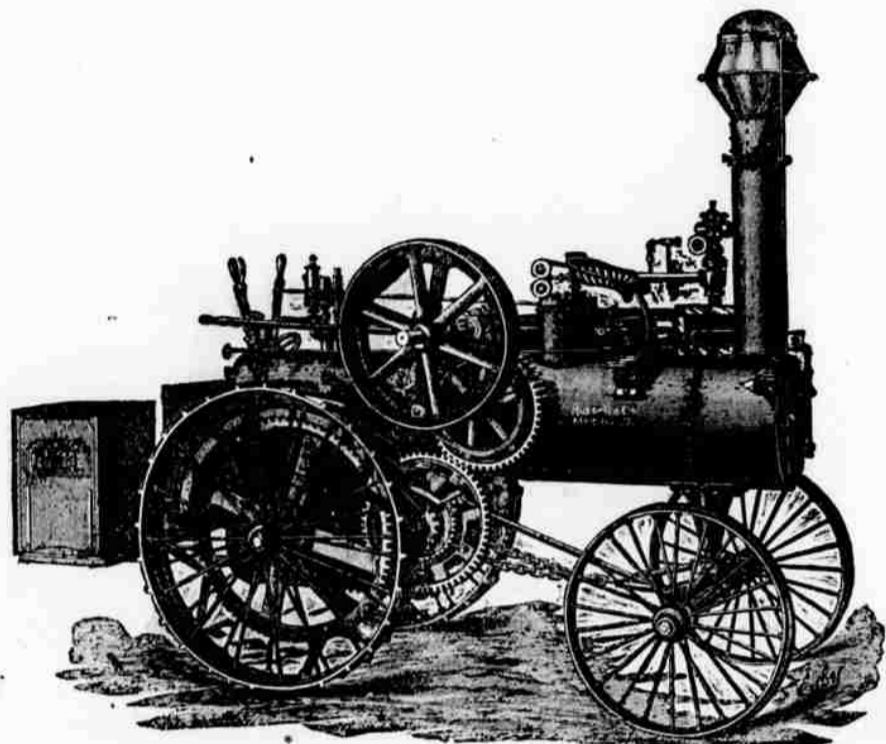

Railway Accident.
New York, June 20.—A fatal railway accident occurred at 2 o'clock this morning on the Baltimore & Ohio railway. Two men were killed and fourteen injured more or less. The wreck was caused by the breaking of the main rod on the killing him instantly. The engine jumped down and crushed behind the firebox. Immediately after a rod on his side gave way and tore that side of the cab in pieces, and the engine then left the rails carrying the cars with it.

A Disgraceful Affair.
NEW ORLEANS, June 20.—Complications in the lottery fight are daily increasing, and the offering made by New York and English capitalists to give more for the charter to do business in this state than the Louisiana Lottery Company proposed, has still further mixed things. An investigation was set on foot today to find out who the men are who are rivals for the Louisiana company's business, and the result has set everybody talking.

Hail Storm in Minnesota.
ST CHARLES, Minn., June 20.—A fearful hailstorm commenced last evening and extended over five miles southeast through the townships of St Charles, Saratoga and Fremont. Great damage was done to all kinds of crops. This storm was immediately followed by the heaviest rainstorm in years. Many farms that had already been mowed by hail were washed of everything movable.

A Big Cyclone.
EMERYVILLE, Ill., June 20.—A terrible cyclone and cloudburst occurred about five miles north of this city shortly after 4 o'clock this afternoon, which resulted in a terrible loss of life and property, no less than fifteen people being killed and a number of houses and barns demolished.
