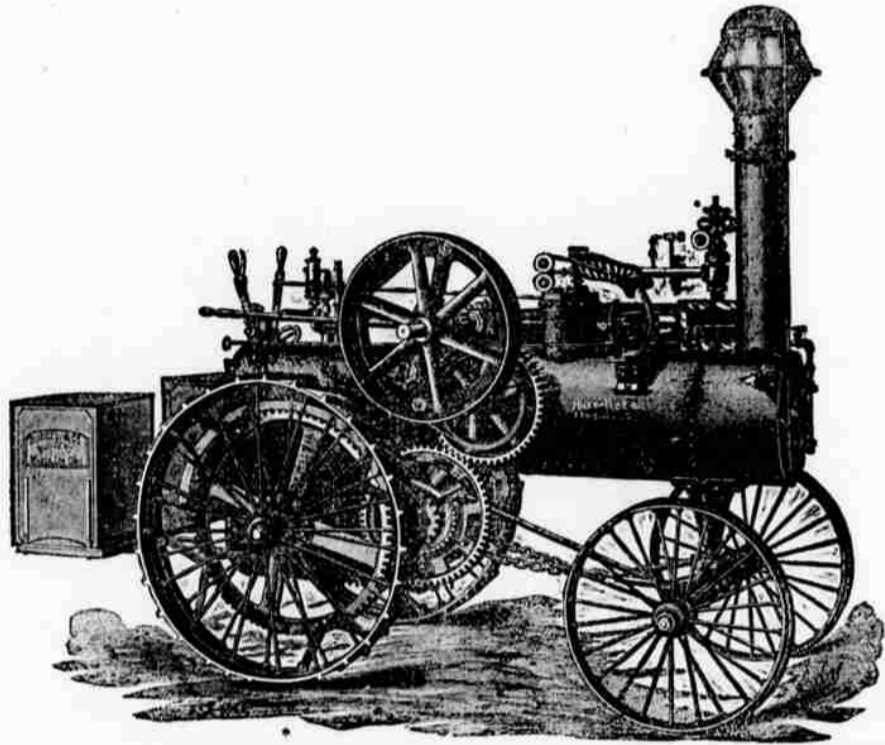

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

An Oregon Strike.
LA GRANDE, June 22.—The employes of the
Union Pacific machine shops at this place
went on a strike this morning. All hands went
to work as usual at 7 o'clock and at 8 o'clock
the whistle blew and all the mechanics stepped
off. This is only a small part of the strike, as it is
said to extend from Postville to Portland, in-
cluding the shops at Fontelle, St. Albans, La
Grande, Tekoa, the Dalles and Allama. The
cause alleged is some dissatisfaction as to wages.

A Murder.
SEATTLE, June 22.—A Post Intelligence
special from Hot Springs says: William W.
Clark, an engineer in the employ of Hard
Brothers & Co., of the Green River lumber and
saw mill, of this place, was most brutally
murdered about 9 o'clock this morning by Burt
Kochman, another employe of the same firm,
engaged as a man of all work around the mill.
The murder was the outcome of an old feud of
about a year's standing.

Equal to California.
WILFESBARRE Pa., June 22.—Two young
men of this city returned in a buggy from a
pleasure resort to-night and were confronted
by three masked highwaymen on the turnpike
where Farmer Rosecrans was murdered two
years ago. Their horses, being frightened by
the dark lanterns, were swept away by a
torpedo which visited the place about 3 o'clock
this afternoon. No one was killed, but a number
were injured.

A Town Sweep.
LINCOLN, Neb., June 22.—A special to the
Journal from Grand Island says the town of
Sweet water, a little hamlet of less than a
hundred inhabitants, was swept away by a
tornado which visited the place about 3 o'clock
this afternoon. No one was killed, but a number
were injured.

Over a Church.
SARATOGA, N. Y., June 22.—Yesterday after-
noon there was a riot at Schuylkill between
a gang of electric light company workmen and
parishioners of the Church of the Visitation
(Catholic), the latter insisting that the workmen
should not set poles in front of the church. No
one was fatally injured, though missiles flew in
showers. Sheriff Dwyer ordered the rioters to
desist. They refused and a fight ensued. Mat-
ters quieted down after several arrests, although
100 men with pistols held other arms, guarded
the church all night and to-day. It is under-
stood that both sides are ready for a fracas
Monday morning, and should the trouble re-
open it is likely the military will be called out.

A Foolish Youth.
TRENTON, N. J., June 22.—Hewitt Van
Metra's body was found to-day in the water
power reservoir. Van Metra, who was a clerk
in a postoffice, had been missing since Wednes-
day. He was engaged to a prominent young
lady, and his jealousy of her led to suicide.
When found, one hand and one leg were tied
together with a cord. A note was found on
the body directing that \$25 be paid the finder
of the corpse. There were also letters to his
parents and to those of the young lady. He
was 20 years old.
