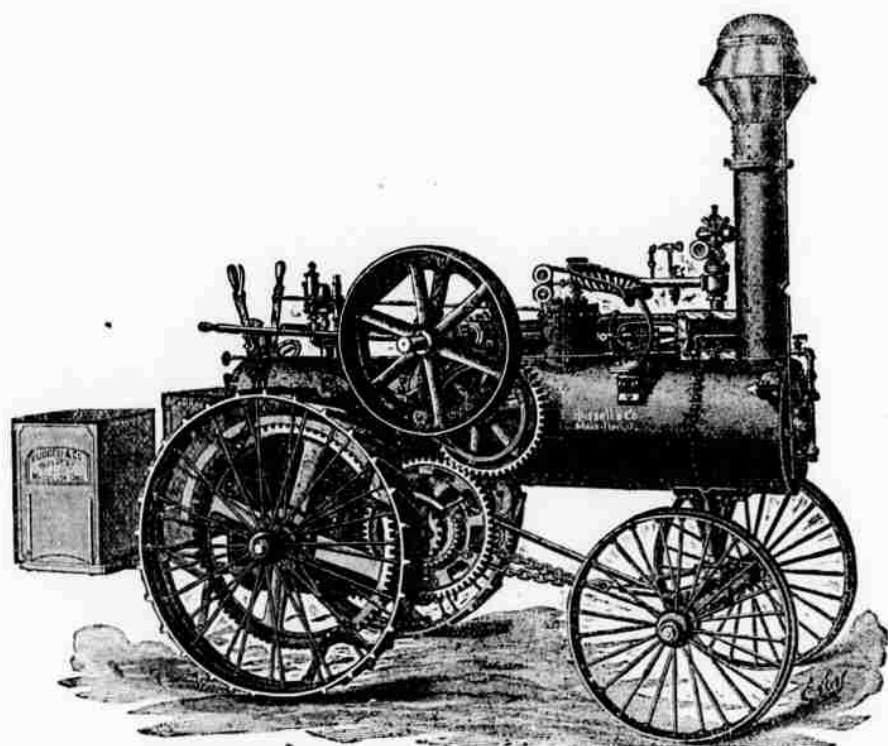

STICK TO THE FACTS.

The Pendleton Tribune says:

"Oregon, with her nearly 70,000 votes cast for congressmen, has but one representative in the lower house, while Georgia has ten representatives for a total of 27,475, or but little more than one third of the vote of Oregon."

It is upon such false statements as the above that the republicans are attempting to build up a sentiment that will sustain them in passing the federal elections bill. The Tribune knows that the basis of representation in congress was the census returns of 1880 which gave Oregon one representative, having 274,000 people. Now, there has been a large increase of population since then, which accounts for the heavy vote. But it says Georgia has ten representatives for 27,475 votes. The Tribune either knew not what it was talking about, or it willfully misrepresented the matter. The vote cast for congress in Georgia was 129,888. Why did the Tribune miss the mark so widely? Will it abuse the minds of its readers by correcting the mistake it made? The Tribune without the least regard to facts says:

"The thirteen congressmen of Indiana represent nearly twice as many votes as were cast for the thirty congressmen from the four states of South Carolina, Mississippi, Georgia and Louisiana; Indiana's aggregate vote being 471,978, while the combined vote of the four states named was no more than 250,311."

Now, the truth is, that the four states of Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi and South Carolina cast 410,386 votes for congress instead of 250,311. Every man knows that the republican party in the south has no organization except in a few localities. Their committees meet and resolve to put no ticket in the field, and then complain that they have been intimidated. The truth is that in many of the elections in the south the democratic as well as the republican vote is not brought out. This truth is made to appear by comparing the election returns for president in Louisiana in 1884 with the returns for governor in 1884. The democratic vote for president in 1884 was 62,529 and the democratic vote for governor in April 1888 was 137,257 making a difference of 73,728. The republican vote for president in 1884 was 46,347 but the republican vote for governor in April 1888 was 51,471 an increase over that party's presidential vote of 5,124. The reason of this is found in the fact that that party made a very earnest campaign for governor, thinking, that owing to some divisions in the democratic party they would be enabled to elect their governor. But it is necessary to have something to place before the people as an excuse for some of the most infamous legislation ever proposed in this country, and this is the kind of "facts" to be used for that purpose.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS**Locusts Caused Several Deaths.**

New York, July 6.—A special to the Herald from Port of Spain to-day says: A fatal railroad accident has just been caused by locusts on the line of the Central railroad, at about twenty miles from Caracas. It appears that an engine and car had been dispatched to pick up workmen employed on construction of the road and bring them to Caracas to receive their pay. When going down a steep grade the engine dashed through a swarm of locusts on the rails. These pests, as they were crushed by the wheels of the locomotive and car, formed a oily substance which made the tracks so slippery that the brakes could no longer hold the train to the rails. The engine, dashing down at a terrific speed, bounded from the line at a curve, and ran into the side of a mountain. The driver and fireman jumped off, and in doing so, sustained severe injuries. Another engine was telegraphed for from Caracas, and a foreman and gang of men accompanied her with appliances to replace the runaway engine on the rails. At the same steep grade, however, engine No. 2 also came into collision with locusts, this time with fatal results. The engine lost all control of its engine. As it dashed down the incline through the tunnel it left the rails at the same curve at which the first locomotive and car had come to grief and telescoped them. So terrible was the collision that the engines and cars were broken to pieces. Three men were instantly killed and fifteen more or less seriously injured. One poor fellow in attempting to jump off the engine as it was going through the tunnel, had his brains knocked out. These killed were buried on the spot.

A Novel 4th.

JOLIET, Ill., July 6.—The Fourth of July was celebrated at the Joliet prison in an original manner. At 7 o'clock Warden Borggren marshaled his force of 1400 men in line and marched them to the east side where the order was given to break ranks. The men uttered a cheer and rushed into each other's arms, yelling to each other: "Hello Bill!" "How long you got?" "When did you get settled?" It was an animated scene and an observer might have noticed the Anarchist Niebo rushing wildly about, when the order was given to break ranks, in search of his fellows, Fielden, and Schwab. When he did find them the greeting was cordial. There were other noted convicts who came to the front and attempted to find their fellows, among whom were such men as Burke, Coughlin and O'Sullivan, the Cronin murderers. When they met there was a comparison of notes and experiences behind the bars.

Hit for Tat.

NEW YORK, July 6.—The Chinese minister to Washington, Tsui, arrived on La Bretagne to-day. A newspaper correspondent was a passenger on the same boat, and according to the reporter, had a long talk with Minister Tsui, a report of which is printed this morning. His excellency's words are said to have been carefully translated by Mr. Lee, the official interpreter to the Chinese legation. The Celestial diplomat is very considerably worried over recent events in this country, so far as the Chinese are concerned.

"Unless the United States government repeals the law which now excludes my countrymen from this country," said the diplomat, "we shall treat Americans to a dose of their own medicine. I mean we shall exclude the citizens of the United States from the Chinese."
