

STATE RIGHTS AGAIN.

Seven years ago the DEMOCRAT predicted that in less than ten years from that time republicans in the west would be talking as strongly in favor of state rights as democrats. Our prediction has been verified. Some days ago we published an extract from a lecture delivered by Justice Hoar of the United States Supreme Court, and a very strong republican, which sounded just like it came from Jefferson, Jackson or Madison. The doctrine enunciated was state rights to the core and sound as a dollar. Then came a letter written by Gov. Humphrey of Kansas on the subject of "Original Packages" in which extreme grounds in favor of state rights were taken. Now comes the Lieutenant Governor of Kansas, A. J. Felt, and in a speech before the Nephela republican county convention in that state, said:

"The supreme court of the United States has overruled the laws of our country, which have stood the test for nearly one hundred years, and has put us within the power of the liquor traffic. While I respect the mandates of the supreme court of the United States, I consider that I owe my first allegiance to the constitution and laws of my state."

For saying that he owed his first allegiance to his state Gen. Lee was denounced as a traitor from Maine to California but, now comes the Lieutenant Governor of "bleeding Kansas," Kansas with its 80,000 republican majority, and utters such strong doctrines on the subject of state rights. The truth is that republicans are just sure to be state rights advocates when the federal government assumes to exercise authority which belongs to the state, and which exercise of authority clashes with the interests of their party. We believe that Lieutenant Governor Felt is right in saying "the Supreme Court has overruled the laws of our country which have stood the test for nearly a hundred years" when it decided that men might ship all kinds of liquor to Kansas and sell in original packages notwithstanding that state has a law prohibiting the sale. But our Kansas republicans are entitled to no sympathy for they have contributed more to the centralization of power in the general government than those of any other state and their representatives in congress to-day stand up and support the infamous federal election bill that is intended to deprive the people of the south of conducting their own elections.

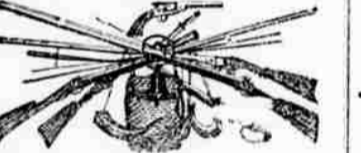

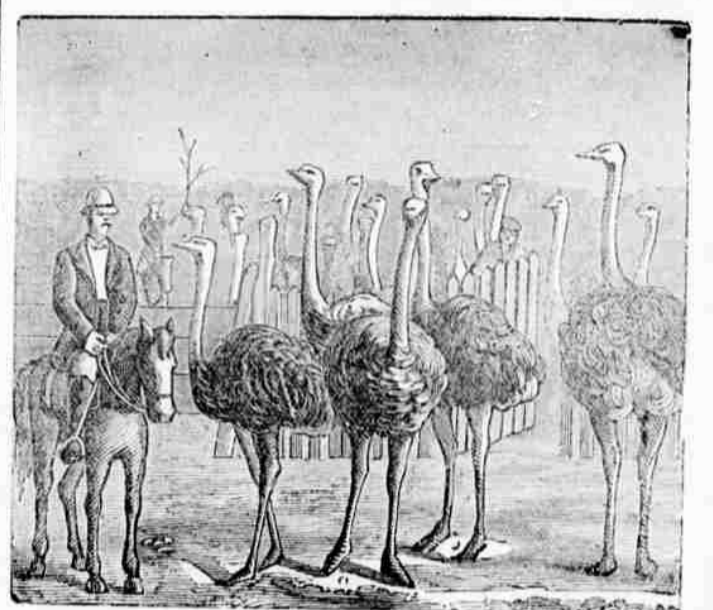
