

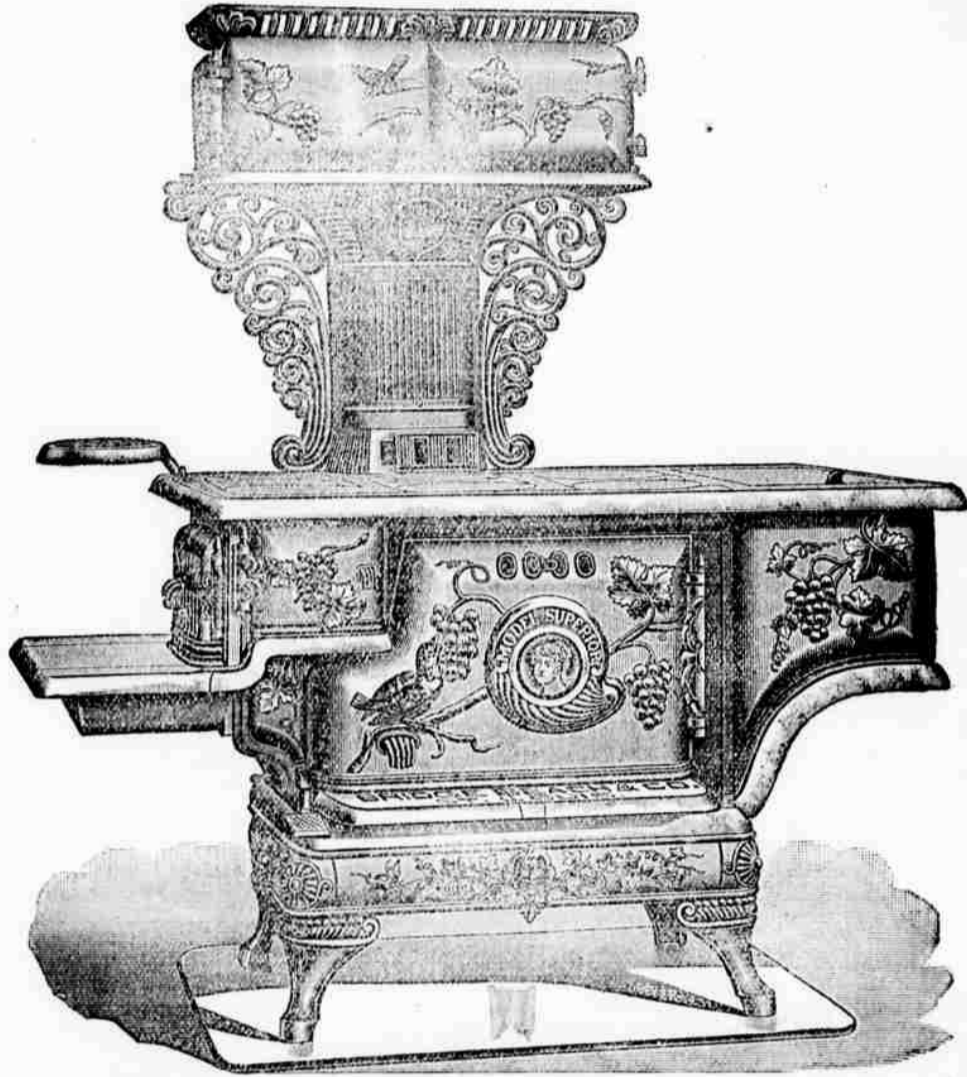

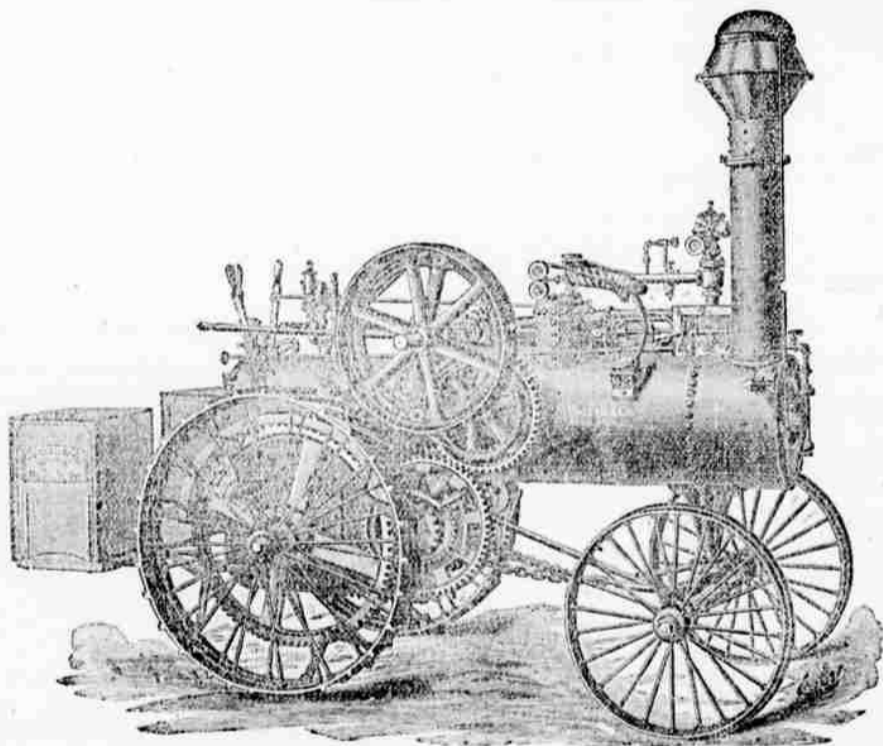

Editors Democrat:
In a recent number of the Oregonian in an article on Gen. McCook, that paper gives Gen. Sheridan the credit of saving Rosecrans' army at the battle of Murfreesboro; when any child who has ever studied U. S. History, knows that it was General Geo. H. Thomas who commanded the center corps of the army that stood like a solid rock, and beat back the onslaughts of Bragg's army, when McCook's corps was driven from the field. I cannot account for this falsification of history by the Oregonian in any other way than from the fact that Gen. Thomas was a southern man and a democrat, for that paper certainly cannot plead ignorance to so notorious a fact.
I do not remember that Gen. Sheridan was there; if he was, he was in a subordinate position for the three corps of Rosecrans' army were commanded by Generals McCook, Thomas and Crittenden. Having seen, under Gen. Thomas, in that memorable battle, I do not like to see the old man's honors conferred upon another and that too when that other does not need them.

EX-SOLDIER.
The mathematical field has recently been at work upon a calculation of the year performed by the human heart. His calculations are curious, and give the work of the heart in miles and beats. It is based upon the presumption that the heart beats sixty nine times each minute, and throws blood nine feet. Computed thus, the mileage of the blood through the body might be taken as 267 yards per minute; seven miles per hour, 168 miles per day, 61,320 miles per year, or 4,292,400 miles a lifetime of seventy years.

A distinctive feature of insects of the grass-hopper family is the manner in which they produce sound. The sharp, stridulating noise with which the air resounds all through the day and far into the midnight is produced by the rubbing of the stiff edges of the wing covers against the basal joint of the hindmost pair of legs; or, in some species, by rubbing the edges of the wings against each other.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Don't Let It Sleep.
WASHINGTON, July 20.—Friends of the river and harbor bill are beginning to have some fear for the future. There have been whisperings about the capitol the past week that perhaps the bill would be allowed to slumber on the calendar of the senate until the adjournment. There is strong opposition to it in certain circles on the ground that the appropriations of this congress have been very large, and that this bill is not absolutely necessary as are the other appropriation bills which have been passed or are awaiting passage.

A Battle.
CITY OF MEXICO, July 20.—El Universal publishes an account of a battle between Guatemala and Salvadorans, in San Salvador, in which the former were defeated with heavy loss. General Guzman, the commander of the Guatemalan force numbered 9000. General Barrandien, the Guatemalan refugee, has left Oaxaca to take part in the war, and he will probably raise the standard in the revolt in Guatemala. Private telegrams from San Salvador say the San Salvadorans captured the Guatemalan artillery in the battle which took place Thursday.

A Man Found Dead.
HILLSBORO, Or., July 20.—Last night this town was suddenly thrown into a state of excitement by the discovery of the body of a dead man hanging in an empty room below the stage of the opera house. It was in a fearful state of decomposition. The body was found about three fourths erect, being suspended by a rope used to elevate baggage to a dressing room of the stage. The man who came to this Charles Dupuis, a Frenchman, whose whereabouts have been inquired for in the Oregonian.

These Damage Suits.
EUGENE, July 20.—The cases in the circuit court against the Oregonian Railway Company for damages, caused by the right of way, have been tried and the special term of court closed this morning. The damages allowed by the jury in the several cases are as follows: G. H. Armitage, \$1777 87 1/2; Henry Spores, \$1030; S. M. Douglas and M. Levinger, \$975; Josephine F. Stevens, \$3000; Josephine Melice, \$25; Jacob Spores, \$3000. The case of A. Fred Bonnett was continued until next term of court. Three of the cases were settled by compromise. There is some talk of the Armitage case being appealed.

Bad Enumerators.
ST. PAUL, July 2.—Five warrants were issued yesterday for Minneapolis enumerators for complicity in the census frauds. But one man Louis Haggerman, was arrested, as the others could not be found. One warrant was for B. Anderson and his wife, and when the story came out, she naively remarked that her husband was in Canada, but that unless he received some money very soon he would return. Two weeks ago several members of the Business Men's union quietly put their heads together, and as a result the enumerators were each supplied with \$25 and a ticket to Canada.
