**STICKS IT FOOT IN IT.**

The *Telegram* nearly always put its foot into it when it opens its mouth to say something mean about the democrats. Yesterday it headed a dispatch: "Another Democrat Makes An Attack On Speaker Reed." "Ex-Speaker Carlisle's Course Held Up As A Siding Example." The following is the dispatch:

"In speaking of one of the senate amendments to the sundry civil bills Struble, of Iowa, made an attack on Speaker Reed for his interest towards the gentlemen having an interest in the public building bill. He contrasted the courteous manner of Speaker Carlisle towards all gentlemen requesting recognition, with the almost sneering manner in which the present speaker treated such requests. The speaker treated the members as though they were boys. He did not propose to stand this sort of treatment any longer without a protest. Should the members, he asked, continue to submit any longer, like cowards, to the dictation of the speaker? Should they not rather combine in an honest attempt to rebel against the rule of the speaker in regard to the public building bill. Struble's remarks were vigorously applauded by democrats."

Now, the truth is, Struble is not a democrat, at all, but a republican who has been made to feel the rod he helped put into Reed's hands to be used exclusively on democratic backs, but, fortunately, Reed has taught many of these gentry to know what the rod means. Reed is an autocrat of the most heartless kind but, that fact does not excite Struble, to any sympathy, at all. Democrats vigorously applauded because of the discomfiture he had brought upon himself.

Who, one short year ago, would have entertained the thought for a moment, that this 300, leading republicans would have been threatening to read Blaine out of his party. And yet so potent is the influence of "the campaign of education," that, even Blaine, heretofore the most distinguished figure in protection circles, has succumbed in part to its far reaching influence. Indeed, it is only a question of time, (and brief time at that,) when the whole fabric of protection will tumble from its foundation and be known as a thing of the past, Selah.

Icebergs originate in West Greenland, which Ensligh Rodmon of the Hydrographic Office calls "the great berg factory." The ice massed in the interior of the country is gradually forced out to sea by glacial movements on land, which advance at the rate of at least fifty feet a day. The glacier is broken in huge masses, when once in the water, by its buoyancy and brittleness and the currents. This process is called calving. A berg varies in size, the average being sixty to 100 feet high and 300 to 500 yards long of exposed surface, which is usually an eight of the whole mass.

That a man can be more of a hermit in a great city than by burrowing in some country hill-side has been shown by a census enumerator in New York. The greatest and most original of the tribe has lived for ten years at the Grand Union Hotel without saying a word to any of the 1,500,000 people who touch elbows with him. He is simply "Bailey," and that is all that is known concerning him.

The thirty machines used in the census office at Washington for counting the population work with clock-like accuracy, and count from one to twenty persons each time a small ivory key is touched. The machine looks like an upright piano in a polished oak case, and has a keyboard like that of a typewriter. Most of the machines are worked by girls, and they are able to count accurately 1,000,000 names a day.

Through the medium of the locomotive telephone signal two trains approaching each other establish communication by closing the circuit when two miles apart. The ringing of a gong warns the engineers, who, by means of the telephone, can talk to each other.

The "inexhaustible" forests of the south will prove so in the same way as have the "inexhaustible" forests of Ohio, Indiana and Michigan. Old settlers are not uncommon in the first two of these states who declare that they have burned enough black walnut, just to get it out of the way to make them millionaires if they had it standing now.

Trees that are struck by lightning before rain sets in are generally shattered, while those that are struck after they become wet are only scarred. The wet outside offers a fairly good conductor for the current, is the inference to be drawn from this fact.

In the sixth congressional district of South Carolina the farmer's alliance men succeeded in nominating their man for congress in the democratic convention. The alliance in North Carolina, South Carolina, and Florida seem to trouble the democrats as much as they do the republicans in the north west.

Senator Hale, of New Hampshire, is said to be opposed to adopted Reed's "gag law" in the senate. He thinks like Edmunds, that there should be one body in the United States government where public measures of importance are permitted to be discussed.

The maximum of production of Florida trees now planted will be 10,000,000 boxes of oranges and 1,000,000 boxes of lemons.

In southwestern France a great population is supported upon the once barren, drifting sands, now fixed by means of plantations of the maritime pine. This yields resin and a cheap illuminating oil distilled from it, besides railway ties, pit props, telegraph poles and fuel. The pit props go to England mainly, 172,000 being the annual shipment to that market. The ties and telegraph poles are mostly used in France. Considerable of the young pine is sent to England to be made into paper.

Recent statistics show that the people of the United States are longer lived than those of Europe. In this country eighteen persons out of every 1000 die each year, in England the average is twenty and in Germany twenty-six.
