

HINTS TO HOUSEKEEPERS.

Potatoes done on a wire broiler are said to excel the fried.

To beat eggs quickly, add a pinch of salt. Salt cools and cold eggs froth rapidly.

Small fruits should be cooked slowly thirty or forty minutes. Preserves keep best in small glass jars or tumblers, with paper dipped in brandy over the tops.

A frying-pan should never touch water. Scour them out with salt the moment they are done with, and wipe clean with a cloth. A washed omelet-pan makes a poor omelet.

Do not light a sick-room at night by means of a jet gas or a kerosene lamp burning low; nothing in pervades the air sooner. Use sperm candles, or tapers which burn open oil.

Keep a cheap knife or a knife with a different handle from those in common use for the sole purpose of peeling onions, and so avoid the flavor and odor of them when it is either expected or desired.

To clean mirrors, sponge them perfectly free from all dirt, drying with soft cloths, and when quite dry rub a little powdered blue over the glass, polishing it finally with a soft silk handkerchief.

Currants, berries and all juicy fruits may be washed, and then cooked without water; then strain, and the juice boiled for fifteen or twenty minutes before adding the sugar, when very little boiling will be required.

The smoked and dusty globes of chandeliers may be nicely cleaned by scrubbing them in hot water, to which a little soda has been added. Then put some ammonia into hot water, immerse the globes and scrub briskly with a stiff brush. Rinse thoroughly and wipe dry.

For reaches, make a flour-paste into which has been stirred, while hot, phosphorus, in the proportion of a dime's worth of the phosphorus to a half-pint of paste; when nearly cold add a quarter as much grease. Put on pieces of board where the reaches are. They will die while eating the paste.

To renovate ostrich feathers, take a smooth whetstone, and beginning at the base of the frond, draw each one lightly but firmly between the thumb and whetstone. If the fronds curl too much, hold them more loosely and further from the quill. Carefully and patiently going over a feather will quite repay the trouble.

A porcelain kettle is best for preserving; too large a quantity should never be cooked at one time. Large fruits may be put in the syrup, cooked rapidly at first and then slowly, to preserve the shape; if the fruit is cooked, and the syrup yet thin, take up a piece at a time carefully, boil the syrup until thick, return the fruit to it and cook slowly.

Gilt picture frames may be brightened by taking sufficient flour of sulphur to give a golden tinge to about 1 1/2 pints of water, and in this hot, four or five bruised onions, or garlic, which will answer the same purpose. Strain off this liquid, and with it when cold, wash with a soft brush any gilding which requires renewing, and when dry it will come out bright as new.

For washing woolen blankets successfully nothing equals borax. Dissolve two tablespoonfuls in hot water, and add the solution to a tub half full of very hot water, enter the blankets and let remain one hour, stirring often and rubbing them with the hands, but never on a washboard, or never applying soap directly to them unless on a very bad stain. Squeeze them out of this suds, prepare another water of the same temperature, containing but one tablespoonful of borax, and enough fine white soap to make a nice suds; immerse the blankets and repeat the same process of cleaning as at first. Afterwards rinse through two clean waters, of the same temperature as the others, and dry. Remember that in washing woollens it is having the water in which you wash them and rise them of widely different degrees of heat, and rubbing impure soap directly on them, which are the two principal causes of shrinkage.

A dispatch states that the steam schooner Mischief returned to Victoria British Columbia a few days ago with the seal skins taken by Canadians in Behring's sea. There were 13,000 skins. Bialne's "brilliant, vigorous, foreign policy" is quite promotive of the interests of foreigners.
