

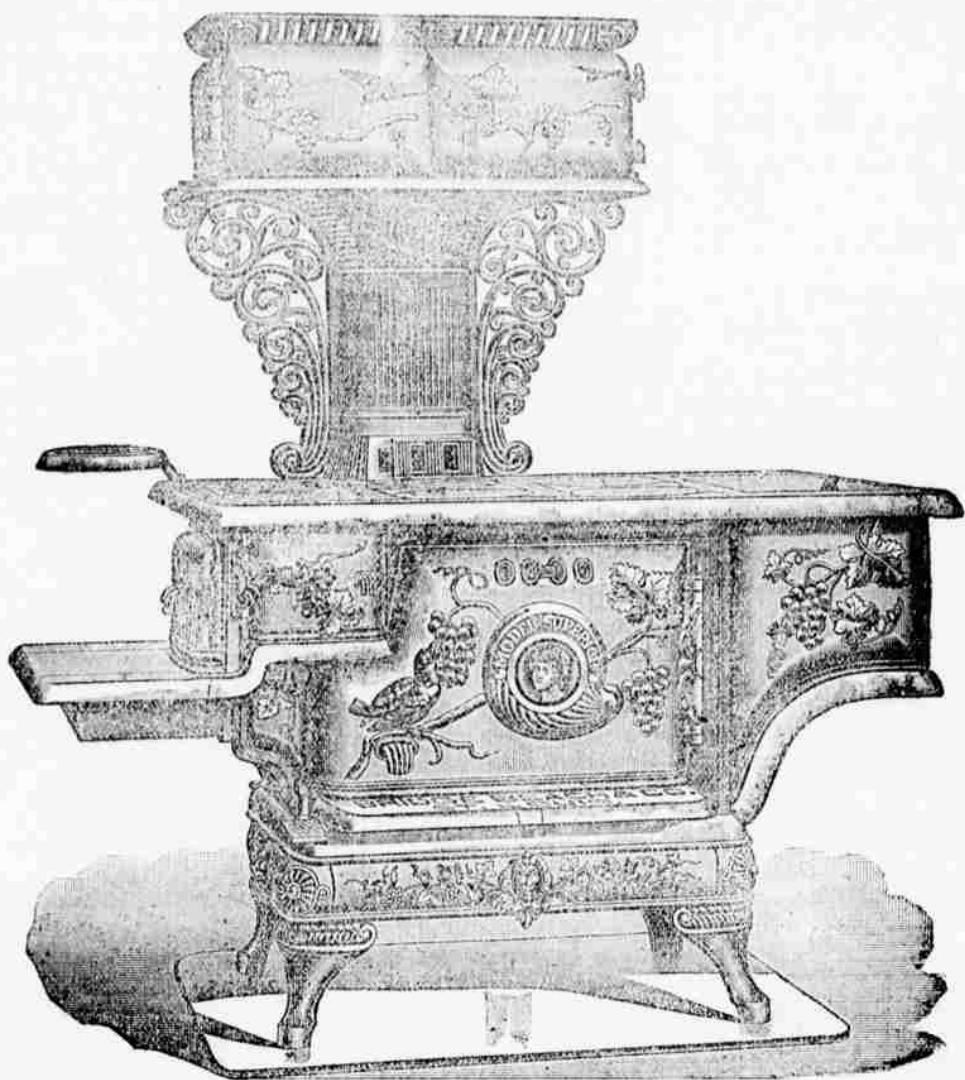

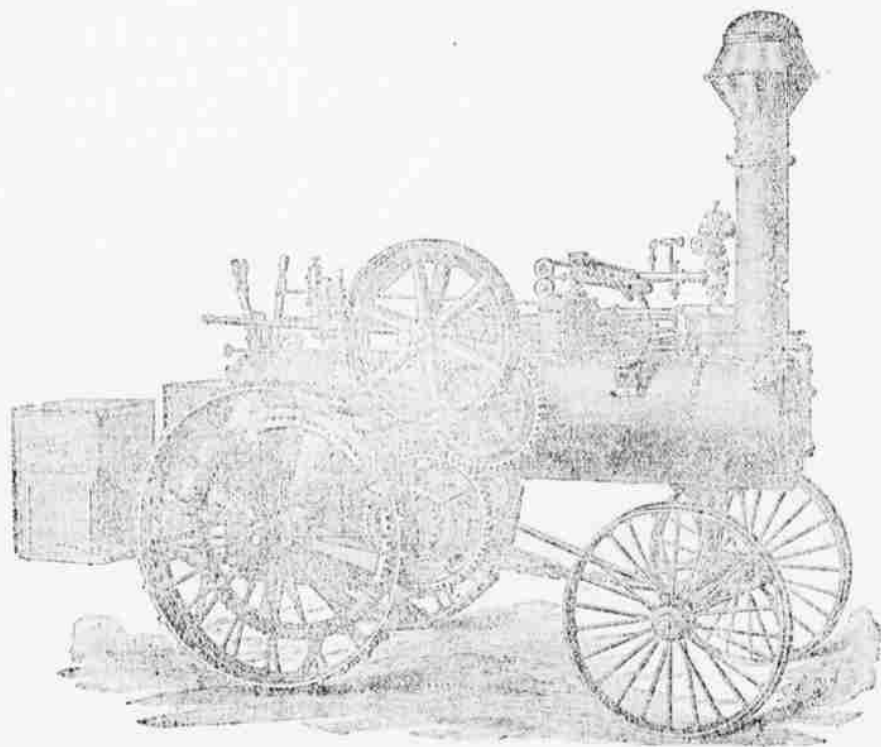

There can be nothing more significant of the purpose of the Republican party in revising the tariff than the vote on Senator McPherson's amendment. On a strict party vote the Republicans refused to agree to the proposition that tariff taxes should not exceed the average ad valorem war tariff rate of 1864. In other words, the Republican Senators announce that they propose to tax the country on imports more heavily for the support of favored manufacturers than it was taxed for the support of troops for the suppression of the rebellion. The vote is a frank admission that the tax is not for revenue nor for protection to "infant industries," but for a bounty to hoary and rich monopolies. It means that in the esteem of Republican Senators manufacturers in peace are worthier than soldiers in war of the people's support.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

The Census.
WASHINGTON, Aug. 5.—Telegrams have been pouring in on the Oregon delegation all day. Not only are the Boards of Trade protesting against the inefficient census, but private individuals and prominent men all over the state are denouncing a census as an act of justice to Oregon. The senators to-day called upon Superintendent Porter and made formal request for a re-enumeration of the state. The telegrams presented by Senators Doherty and Mitchell yesterday from the Boards of Trade in Oregon were one each from Portland, Salem, Albany, Astoria, Baker City, McMinnville and Roseburg. The secretary expresses his wish to comply with the request made when there is presented a specific statement as to the alleged imperfections in the census. He says that no proofs have been submitted as to census error and that all charges of incompetency and errors have been disproved by the special agent of the department who was directed to investigate matters at Portland.

A Tragedy at Ellenburg.
ELLENBURG, July 5.—Yesterday shortly after noon at Roslyn, Pat Hovey, a white liveryman keeper, and Miles Mayo, a colored man, quarreled about a horse. Hovey struck Mayo, when the latter pulled a large pocket knife and plunged it into Hovey. It penetrated a lung, making a very dangerous and probably fatal wound. Deputy Sheriff Mat Miller immediately arrested Mayo and lodged him in the city jail, but talk of lynching being heard, Mayor Miller, Deputy Sheriff Miller and City Marshal Neal took the prisoner out of jail and brought him to Ellenburg for safe keeping.

Indian style.
ABERDEEN, Miss., Aug. 5.—Eight miles east of Aberdeen Sunday night while a party of eight colored people returning from church they were fired upon from ambush. Susan Henry was killed instantly by a shot from her husband, Ben Henry, seriously wounded. It is not known what was the motive for the deed. Efforts have been made to hunt down the perpetrators of the crime.

A Nice Little Picnic.
ELIZABETH, N. J., Aug. 5.—A desperate fight occurred at a picnic of the Abieter Turn Verein at Elizabeth's Grove last night, nearly 200 men taking part in the affair. Six police men were badly handled by infuriated anarchists. During the riot the American flag, floating from a staff at the entrance of the grounds, was torn down and trampled under foot. Warrants are out for a dozen of the rioters.

World's Record Broken.
BOSTON, Aug. 5.—At Deacon park to-day J. H. Claussen, of Boston, of the Athletic association, succeeded in breaking the world's amateur record for a running hop step and a jump, making 44 feet 5 inches, as against M. W. Ford's record of 44 feet 1 1/4 inches, made in New York in May last.
