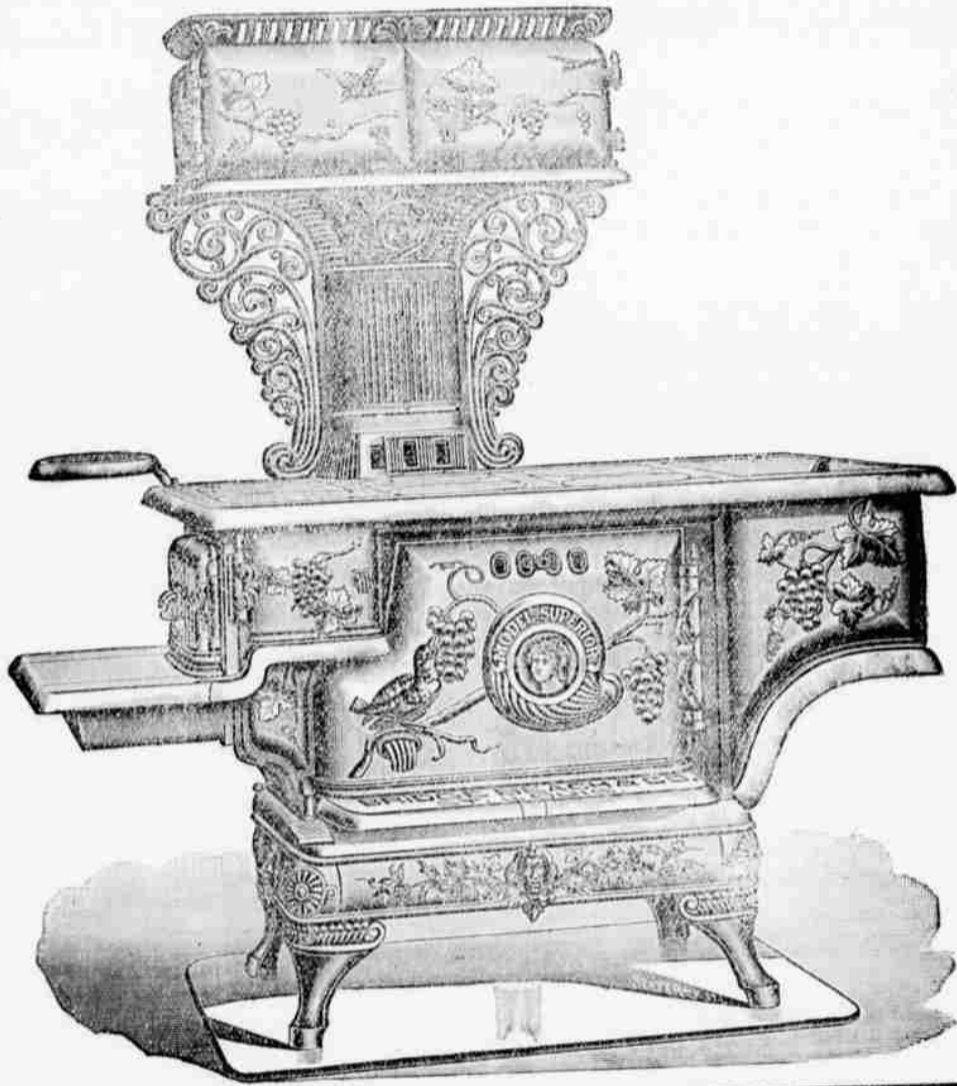


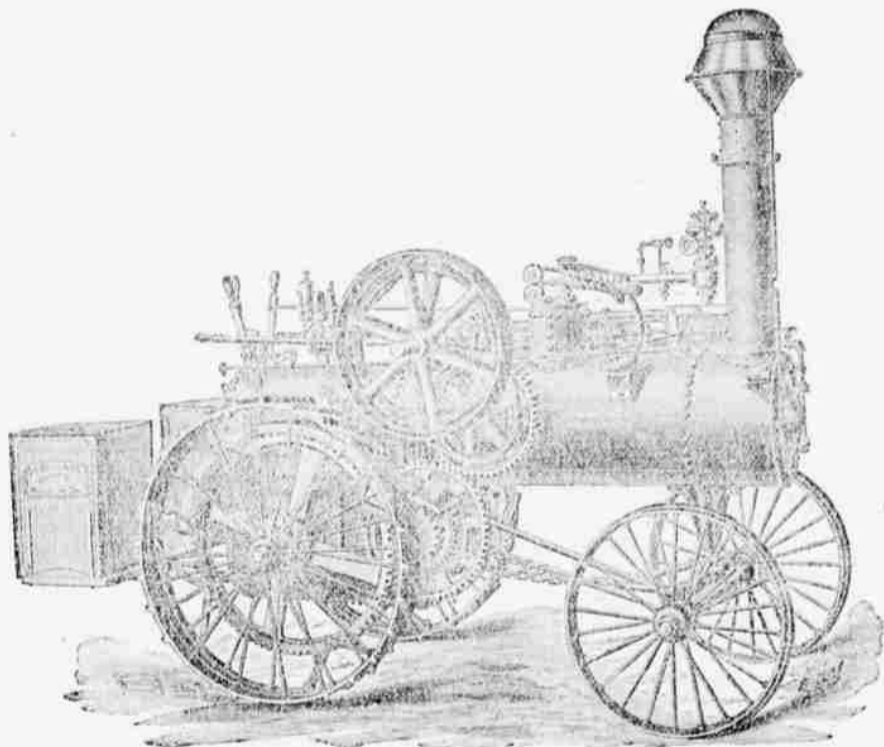

The Chicago Tribune a strong republican paper gives out the following warning: The Minnesota senators and representatives have had their instructions. Their constituents have told them plainly that as between Blaine and McKinley, between the policy of wider markets for the American farmer and restricted ones, they are for the first every time. The republicans of the great corn and hog raising state of Nebraska also held their convention this week. Instead of endorsing the McKinley bill they demanded "a revision of the tariff in the interests of the producer and laborer." In this case the farmers who grow corn and raise hogs and cattle. The Nebraska farmer does not think he is protected by a McKinley tariff revision which raises the duties on corn, which is not in-ported to compete with him. He wants the tariff revised after the old republican fashion, by reducing the cost of what he consumes or enlarging his markets, and thus giving him better prices for what he produces.

### TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

#### A Peculiar Case.

SEATTLE, Aug. 6.—Several days ago James and Thomas Buell, brothers of a well known grocer, and young men of previous good standing in the community were arrested on charges of robbing the "change rack" on small grocery and notions stores about town. This afternoon the announcement came, when the truth was known, that the arrest of George Howe and James McClellan, young men who so closely resemble the Buell boys in appearance as to be easily mistaken for them. The elder Buell claims that these two men are the real "film flammers," and that his brothers are the innocent victims of an unfortunate similarity in appearance. The police are puzzled; but are inclined to the belief that the last men arrested are the guilty parties, and will hold them until the matter can be thoroughly investigated. The Buell boys have been released on bail.

#### The Oregon Census.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6.—According to the postal card returns in the census office Oregon has 303,014 people. Of course these are subject to considerable revision when the count is made from the schedule returns which are not yet complete. The first of West district passed over by Supervisor Kelly has 231,901 and Supervisor Strang's district has 71,410. Telegrams have been coming in all day from people in every part of the state demanding a recount. These telegrams the census officials say do not specify any particular instances of fraud nor that any counties or districts or parts of districts have been omitted.

#### The Central American War.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 6.—Domingo Escheta, Guatemalan consul general in this city, received a dispatch to-day from the Guatemalan minister at the city of Mexico stating that General Yrigoyen, leader of the revolt against Barrios, has been ousted by Guatemalan troops at Palo Grand. Yrigoyen, vice president of San Salvador, has organized a government in the Salvadoran territory in opposition to that of Escheta, and is being aided by General Miranda, one of the most important men of the republic. The 31st patch also stated that Escheta had shot many people connected with the rival movement, among whom were many important personages.

#### Opposition to Lotteries.

BATON ROUGE, La., Aug. 6.—At the State Farmers Alliance meeting 29 day, President Adams, referring to the attitude of the alliance toward the Louisiana Lottery, cited the fact that the alliance was the first secular organization to announce its opposition either to re-chartering the Louisiana Lottery or any other lottery. This opposition stands as a pledge on the part of the order which must be kept in violation.

#### A President Resigned.

BUENOS AIRES, Aug. 6, 4:30 P.M.—President Celman has been compelled by popular clamor to resign, and Vice President Pellegrini has assumed the presidency. It is expected that Senor Mitre, Costa, Gremignani and Levalle will enter the new cabinet. Public confidence is reviving, and gold is quoted at 170.
