The fashion for young New Yorkers to go to London to have the wedding ceremony, where it will be convenient for dukes and countesses to run in and honor them, is the height of Anglomania ridiculous.

The leaves of the pawpaw tree are employed by the negroes in washing linen, as a substitute for soap. They have also the property of rendering meat wrapped in them tender, owing to the alkaloid papain which they contain, and which acts as a solvent.

Recent investigation has shown that the people of Great Britain swallow over 5,000,000 pills daily, or one pill a week for every person in the population. The pill consumption for one year would weigh 170 tons, and would fill thirty-six freight cars.

Senator Ingalls announces that congress will adjourn when it has passed the tariff bill, the appropriations bill and the federal elections bill. If it doesn't adjourn until that time the members may as well engage their fall and winter quarters.

Mr. Powderly is entirely right in urging workmen to oppose the Lodge Force bill with all their might. That bill aims at the destruction of free elections, and free elections are the condition of liberty for the masses, who constitute nine-tenths of the people in America.

Mr. Powderly says that the Lodge Force bill "passed the House of Representatives without the advice or consent of the people of the United States." True. It is a bill intended to suppress the people of the United States and to place the control of elections in the hands of partisan agents charged with the duty of returning a pre-arranged majority to congress.

Contrary to all precedent, Speaker Reed has made up the Raun investigating committee without including in it Mr. Cooper, on whose motion the investigation is undertaken. This proceeding bears a close resemblance to the exclusion of the prosecuting attorney from the courtroom pending a trial.

Edward Wakefield, in his History of New Zealand, estimates that the introduction of bumble-bees into that country has already profited the farmers to the extent of \$5,000,000. Before their introduction it was impossible to grow red clover seed for lack of fertilizing agents.

The best way to remove the smell of paint is to first render the room as nearly as possible air tight by closing the windows, doors and other openings. Place a vessel of lighted charcoal in the room, and throw on it two or three handfuls of juniper berries. After twenty-hours the smell will have entirely disappeared. Another method of doing the same thing is to plunge a handful of new hay into a pail of water and let it stand in the newly painted room.

The labor organizations have about decided to make an incursion into Speaker Reed's district and defeat him at the next election. The Federation of Labor, the Knights of Labor and the other labor organizations have petitioned the speaker, sent delegates to wait on him and in every way have endeavored to induce him to give labor bills a chance, but up to the present time they have received no response. A prominent labor man said today:

"I have made frequent inquiries of the chairman of the committee on labor in regard to this matter and have invariably been told that it rested entirely with the speaker; that the speaker had promised him time and again that he would give his committee a chance to consider its bill, but his promises did not seem to amount to anything."

It is against the speaker, therefore, as the person who is chiefly responsible for this baring of bills of great interest to labor, that the labor organizations will now direct their efforts.

The annual snowfall in Colorado is enormous. At Dillon, according to the Enterprise, the snowfall there from the first day of November, 1889, to Nov. 10, 1890, was twenty feet ten inches. At Kokomo in 1884-5, by actual daily measurements, something like ninety-six feet of the beautiful fell between Nov. 1 and June 1. Of course it kept on settling all the time, and when spring opened up there wasn't more than six or seven feet on the ground.

It may be just as well to mention that Uncle Sam's dominion extends a little more than half way around the globe. Therefore, when any of her majesty's subjects get off that chestnut about the sun never setting on the British dominions, we can brag of the same thing too. The distance from the easternmost point in Maine to the westernmost island in Behring Sea is a little more than 196 degrees of longitude, so that it is full sun up in Maine before it is sundown in Behring Sea.






