Blaine, after thirty years of public life, has just given the first evidence that he possessed the qualities of statesmanship, and one doesn't have to hunt far to find humor in the fact that the republican party wants to punish him for it by declaring him a mugwump.

A CURIOUS PUZZLE.

By use of the table given below you can, says the St. Louis *Republic*, ascertain the name of any person or place, providing the rules below the lettered diagram are strictly observed:

Have the person whose name you wish to know inform you in which of the upright columns the name is contained. If it is found in but one column, it is the top letter; if it occurs in more than one column, it is found by adding the alphabetical numbers of the top letters of the columns in which it is to be found, the sum being the number of the letter sought. By taking one letter at a time, in the way outlined above, the whole word or name may be plainly spelled out. Take the word Jane as an example. J is found in the two columns beginning with B and H, which are the second and eighth letters of the alphabet; their sum is ten, and the tenth letter down the alphabet is J, the letter sought. The next letter, A, appears in but one column, the first, where it stands at the head. N is seen in the columns headed with B, D and H, which are the second, fourth and eighth letters of the alphabet; added, they give the fourteenth, or N, and so on. The use of this table will excite surprise among those unacquainted with the rules of explanation.

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Eugene City Bonds For Sale.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT under the provisions of an act of the Legislature of Oregon entitled, "An act to incorporate the City of Eugene and to repeal all acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 20th, 1890, the common council of the City of Eugene will issue and dispose of the bonds of said city at par value of from \$50,000 to \$500,000, in denominations of from \$100 to \$1000 as the purchaser may desire, payable 30 years after date of issuing the same, with interest thereon at the rate not to exceed 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually.

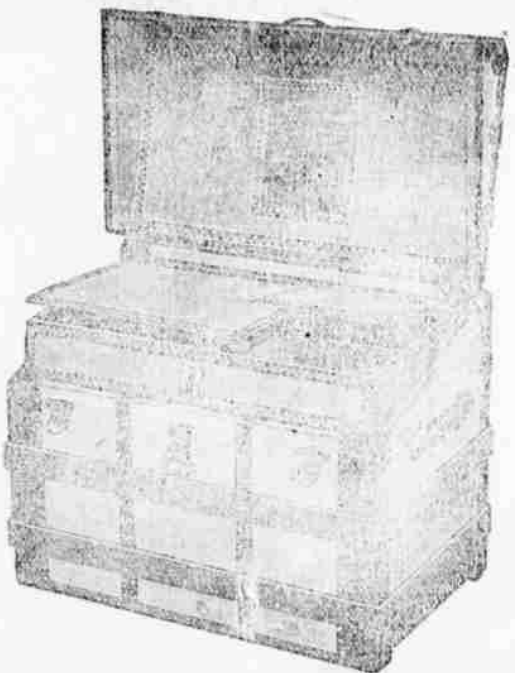
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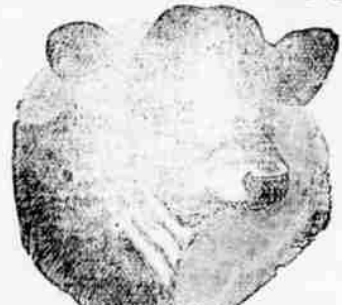

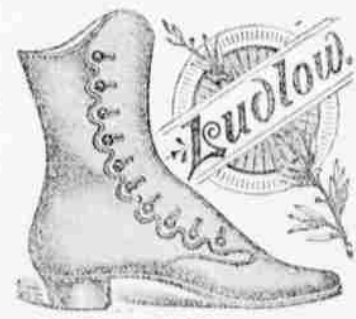
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
