We will vote together regardless of politics, for we have come to the conclusion that it is about time to take care of ourselves."—Union Signal.

One court has pronounced the famous Dracut, Mass., \$9000 licensed house a public nuisance, and has ordered its removal. It goes to the higher court now for final decision. The license may expire before that comes.

The late national convention of the Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor, held in St. Louis, adopted the following on the subject of temperance: Since the implacable enemy of righteousness and purity of Christ and His Church is the intoxicating cup, therefore, Resolved, That we condemn intemperance in every form; that we stand for total abstinence, for the suppression of the saloon, and for the annihilation of the power of the whiskey ring in the politics of this nation.—Nat.
