HINTS TO HOUSEKEEPERS.

Mix stove macking with spirits of turpentine. It will take off the rust, polish easier, and stay glossy longer than when water is used.

Fold a bread cloth small and lay over the top of the pan, taking it off some time before baking the bread, so that the dough can rise well above the tin before putting it in the oven.

A simple cough remedy is made of an ounce of flaxseed boiled in a pint of water, a little honey added, an ounce of rock candy and the juice of three lemons, the whole mixed and bottled well.

A pound of sugar is usually required to every pint of juice, though less may be used in making currant or ripe grape jellies. For straining the juice, it should never be extracted by squeezing, but allowed to drip through the jelly bag.

If jelly does not "firm" the next day after being made, it is useless to cook it over. If it does not become firm when first cooled, standing it in the sun before it will sometimes assist in hardening it. Jelly should be well covered and kept in a cool, dry place.

Always sift all kinds of meal and flour, taking a wire sieve, as a hair sieve is too fine measuring before sifting, unless otherwise directed. It makes a great difference for corn bread what kind of meal is used. Always use the yellow bolted meal for brown bread, and for any recipe for corn bread, unless while meal is specified.

Half-pint jelly-glasses are the best. They should be rinsed in scalding water and dried, then stood up side by side in some large pan, and filled with the jelly to the brim. Allow them to stand a day or two in some sunny window, cover them, if possible, with bits of glass, and as the moisture gathers on the underside wipe it carefully away.

Save the small paper bags carefully which groceries come in; they are useful in many ways. Slip the hand in one when you black the stove, and you will not soil it. When flies abound, slip them over the clean lamp-chimneys during the day. After fruit is canned draw them over the can, and label them plainly; the action of the light causes more fruit to spoil than any other one thing.

Prof. Alex. Winchell is credited with the invention of a cement that will stick to anything. Take two ounces of clear gum arabic, 1/2 ounce of fine starch and one-half ounce of white sugar. Pulverize the gum arabic and dissolve it in as much water as the laundress would use for the quantity of starch indicated. Dissolve the starch and sugar in the gum solution. Then cook the mixture in a vessel suspended in boiling water until the starch becomes clear. The cement should be thick as tar, and should be kept so. It can be kept from spoiling by dropping in a lump of gum camphor, or a little oil of cloves or sassafras. This cement is very strong indeed, and will stick to glazed surfaces, and is good to repair rocks, minerals or fossils. The addition of a small amount of sulphate of aluminum will increase the effectiveness of the paste, besides helping to prevent decomposition.

France has supplemented her discrimination against American pork by imposing a duty of 33 cents a bushel on American grain while that from all other countries is taxed only 15 cents per bushel. This is probably in retaliation for the McKinley bill. It is not only true as Mr. Blaine remarked that the bill contains not a line that will make a market for the products of our farms and factories, but it is operating sharply to close against us the market which we already have. Trade prohibition, as we shall yet learn, is a game two can play at. We cannot shut out the products of other countries and expect them to keep open markets for us.

The loftiest spire in the world is that of the Cathedral of Ulm in Germany. The last stone has just been put in position, 513 years after the building was begun in 1377. The spire is 530 feet high, eighteen feet more than that of the Cathedral of Cologne. The latter was finished in 1880, after having been 632 years in building. The two examples show that with patience almost anything can be accomplished.

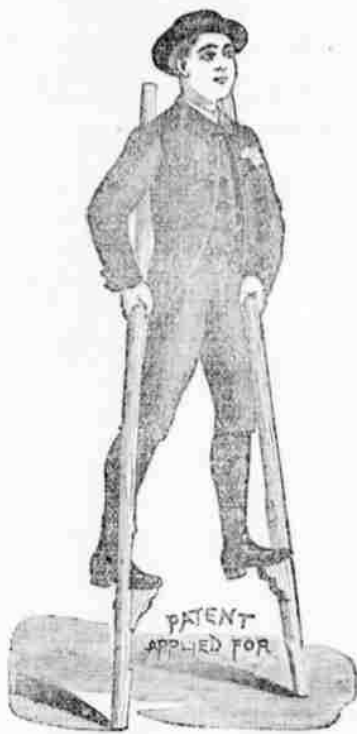

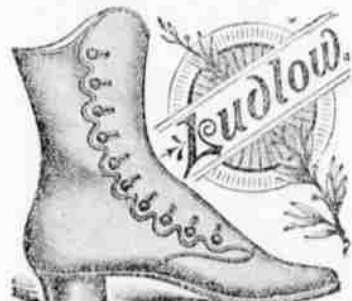
