The delay in the passage of the tariff bill has caused an increase of \$30,000,000 in imports since the tariff became known, which, with the duties, has taken about \$45,000,000 in money from the market.

England's duty on coffee is 3.36 cents per pound; on ground coffee, 4 cents; beer and ale, \$7.50 per barrel; cocoa 2 cents; tea, 12 cents; tobacco, 84 cents; besides on nearly all fruits—currants, figs, prunes, raisins, etc.—liquors, wines, etc., and still people call her a free trade country.

The gerrymander which assures the absence of Mr McKinley from the next congress is as wrong in principle as any other gerrymander. But its victim is stopped from uttering one word against gerrymandering by his lawless and shapeless tariff gerrymander. That is worse than a whole bunch of "shoestring."

A dispatch from Pittsburg says that ground has been bought upon which a tin plate factory will be built as soon as the McKinley bill becomes a law. This recalls the fact that in anticipation of the salary grab of 1873—Dunell, of Minnesota got already to build a house and the moment the bill passed he telegraphed to his agent, "Begin hauling sand."

The senate voted on party lines, to continue the tax on salt. The excuse given was that the price of American salt is now very low. If the tariff does not enhance the price of domestic salt it falls to "protect." If it does permit charging of a higher price, it is an unjust burden upon a necessary article of universal use.

There is much criticism of Senator Ingalls because of his declaration that there is no conscience and no ten commandments in politics. It should be remembered that Mr. Ingalls' experience has been altogether in the republican party. A man's surroundings have a great influence upon his opinions.

Opposed to the force bill are the following prominent republican newspapers: Boston Advertiser, Philadelphia Telegraph, Bulletin and Inquirer, St. Louis Globe-Democrat, New York Pioneer Press, and the Brooklyn Standard-Union. Field, Marshall, Murat, Halstead in command.

Fifteen thousand people, of whom a large majority were farmers, gathered at Greenup, Ill., on Monday to hear an address by Representative Mills of Texas, on the tariff question. Previous to the address the representative held a reception of an hour's duration in the hotel parlors. In his speech Mr. Mills did not confine his remarks to the tariff alone, but found time to express his opinion on the Lodge force bill, which he characterized as one of the most atrocious and malignant pieces of sectional legislation that had been attempted since the war, and clearly showed that it is a measure devised by a decaying political party to assure them of continued control by suppressing a free ballot in the southern states. The farmers cheered until they were hoarse when Mr. Mills concluded.

And now comes Idaho out of the crucible of the census enumeration with a beggarly total of a little more than 84,000 people, Indians and Chinese included. And yet Idaho is to be made the equal of New York in representation in the United States Senate, and must send one member to the House whatever may be the rank of representation. If that should turn out to be 180,000, Idaho is clearly entitled to less than half a member of the House, and it is a gross and glaring outrage to have it send two representatives to the United States Senate. But of such things is the policy of the republican party to-day. Nothing seems to be too desperate for its leaders to attempt in the way of defeating the legitimate expression of the popular will and extending the party's lease of power.

The statistics of railroads are rather imposing. They have 30,000 locomotives drawing nearly a million cars over 153,385 miles of road, operated by 77,843 employees and 1,705 organizations, carrying in one year 472,000,000 passengers and 540,000,000 tons of freight, with a gross earnings of \$967,000,000 and net earnings of \$320,000,000. Great country, isn't it.

Plumb has won the place long held but recently vacated by Allison as leader of the western republicans. Allison shrank from his post, and his failure nearly cost him his seat and did cost his party the governorship of Iowa. Plumb saw that Ingalls' halting course would have the same result in Kansas, and if that state is saved to the republicans it will be through Plumb's western pluck and not through Ingalls' brilliancy.

Quay and Delamater are but types, more than usually readable, of the influences which absolutely control the republican party to-day. Special interests and bargains in which the richest and the trickiest get the plums are the backbone and the policy of Quay's party. Why should he be objected to by anybody who sticks to the party he exactly typifies? The fight in Pennsylvania is the national struggle on a part of the map.

The scheme is to have a labor convention and to nominate a labor leader to run as an independent candidate against Dalzell in order to have the democrats endorse this candidate. A majority of the Pittsburg politicians think Quay is laying himself out for a defeat by running up against Dalzell.

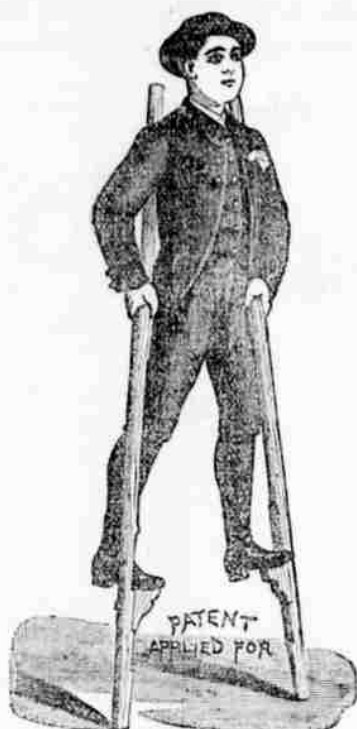

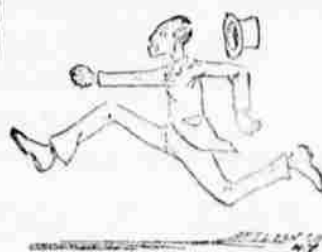
