

COOLING DOWN.

A FALLACY.

The sugar makers of this country as well as the sugar consumers will be well protected by the compromise in the tariff bill agreed upon by the committee of conference.

The manufacturers of sugar in the United States will be paid a bounty of 2 cents per pound on all sugar testing not less than ninety degrees by the polariscope made from beets, sorghum, cane and maple sap within the United States, and all sugar testing less than ninety degrees and not less than eighty degrees, a bounty of 1 1/2 cents a pound.

All sugars imported below the line of sixteen Dutch standard will be free of duty.

All sugars above 16 in color shall pay a duty of 1/2 of a cent per pound, provided, that all sugars above number 16 in color shall pay 1-10 of a cent per pound in addition to the rate provided for when exported or is the product of any other country.

Here is a stupendous fallacy. It is not difficult to understand how the sugar makers of this country are protected under the McKinley bill. This is not a disputable proposition, because the duty and bounty together provided for in that bill more than equals the present duty. But that consumers are protected by it is too absurd for serious consideration. The two cents must be added to the sugar when the consumer buys as the government has to pay this bounty out of the people's money.

IT IS UNCONSTITUTIONAL.

Judge Boise rendered a decision the other day in the Yamhill county circuit court involving the constitutionality of the act of the last legislature appropriating state funds to build a wagon road over in the coast section of the country. We have not seen the decision, nor have we been informed as to the grounds upon which he bases it, but any one at all conversant with the constitution of the state need not be uncertain as to what part that instrument was violated in the passage of the act in question.

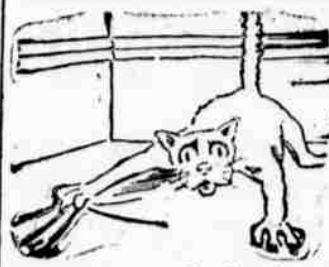
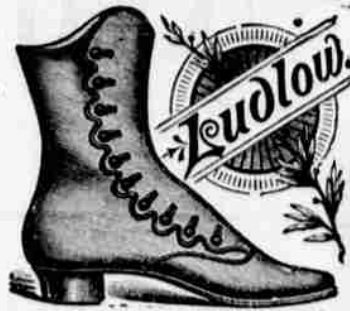
