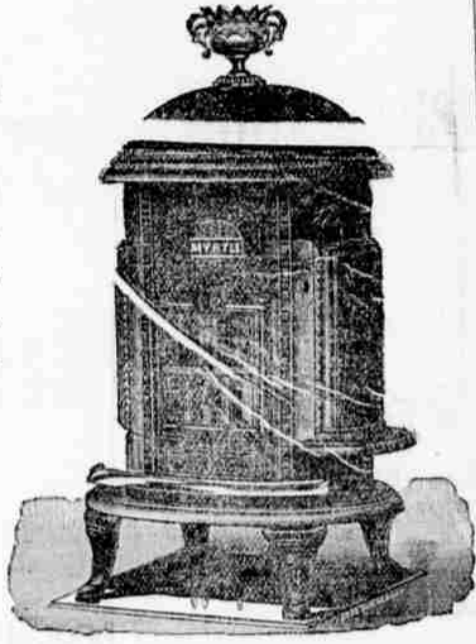

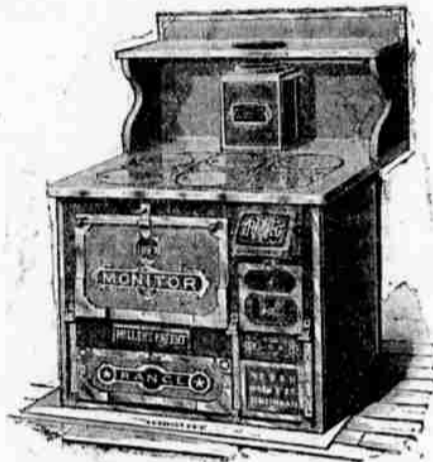

N. W. Improvements.
WASHINGTON Oct 17.—The projects for the improvements of the lower Columbia and Willamette, the upper Columbia and Snake rivers, and the Coquille have been approved by war department. The improvement proposed at Coos bay and Chehalis rivers were today approved. The and the projects for the improvement of the mouth of the Columbia and Yaquina bay, approved last month are the only projects for Oregon and Washington improvements that have reached the chief of engineers.

SEATTLE Oct 17.—A damage suit brought here by Leslie Bushnell today in the superior court against Wm Williams a capitalist, promises to develop into the most sensational case that Seattle has witnessed in many a day. The plaintiff a prepossessing young English woman of 24 and her complaint alleges seduction under promise of marriage, and asks for damages for \$25,000. He is the owner of property valued at \$200,000.

A Rich Strike.
TELLURIDE, Oct 17.—Telluride is ablaze with excitement, flags are flying men are cheering. The Sheridan tunnel struck a vein and developed a large body of ore of a high grade. The tunnel was commenced in 1877, is 3500 long and cost \$300,000. Manager Waters says, calculating on the basis of what the mine has done in the past this strike puts \$15,000,000 in sight.

The Pen.
SALEM Oct 17.—Superintendent Downing today filed his quarterly report. It shows a total of 314 convicts now in prison, a decrease of 13 in three months; total expenditures during the quarter \$11,761.07; earnings \$4812.14, and receipts \$4368.95; 215 convicts are employed in the laundry, 20 in the brickyard and the balance about the prison. No women are in the prison now.
