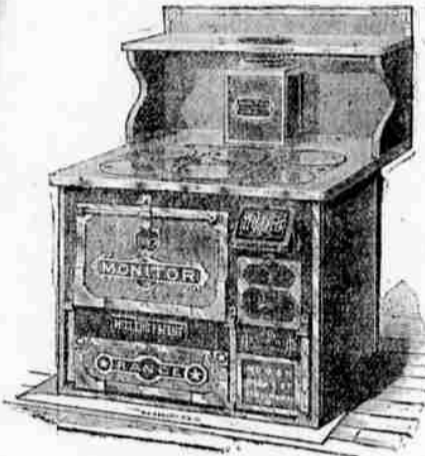

MONMOUTH.

The opening of the Oregon State Nor-
mal School Sept 30th, 1890, was the most
successful which ever occurred. The
new building was completed and looked
as though it were welcoming the eager
throngs of students and guests who had
early gathered here to celebrate the first
day of the new school year.
Many of Oregon's most distinguished
citizens were present and in most elo-
quent speeches showed how deeply inter-
ested they were in the well fare of the
school.

The school opened with an enrollment
of 140 students, and though in operation
but four weeks there are now nearly 190,
and I feel safe to say before the term ends
there will be 200.

Under our able faculty, President Camp-
bell, Vice President Prof Powell, Prof
Sarah Tutthill, Prof Dunn, Prof Shedd
and Assistant W. A. Waun, we feel success
to be ours.

The school has succeeded in securing the
services of one of the finest elocution-
ists on the coast, Prof Sarah Tutthill, and
much good work in this line is expected.

The best facilities are provided for those
who wish to take music, under Miss Har-
rett, and painting under Miss Gibson.

There are in the school three literary
societies, the Vesperettes for ladies and
the Eureka and Washingtonian for gen-
tlemen.

The young gentlemen have also organ-
ized a military company called the "O S
U S Cadets Co A," and are doing nicely
under the command of the experienced
Capt Bailey.

Linn county is well represented this
year, there being six from Albany alone,
Mr Jordan, Mr Powell, Miss Carothers,
Miss Anstyn and Miss Powell. There are
also others from different parts of the
county.

One of Monmouth's most noticeable
features is the motor which runs from
here to Independence. This is very con-
venient, as there are few stores in Mon-
mouth.

The one gathering place is the Post
Office here every evening, just at train
time one and all are assembled waiting
for a letter from home. But, oh, how

Oregon's Population.

WASHINGTON, Oct 20.—The census bureau
to day completed the tabulation of returns for
the first district of Oregon. This completes
the population of that state. The popu-
lation as the bureau claims it is 312,440. In
1880 it was 174,768, showing a gain during
the census period of 137,768, or 78.8 per cent.

They Got Left.

WASHINGTON, Oct 20.—There is a painful
rumor in circulation here to the effect that
the members of congress who went into a pool
for the purchase of a large quantity of silver before
the bill passed have been unable to dispose of
their holding, and are likely to carry them
some months before the deal reaches the
quotations of a month or six weeks ago. It
is understood the pool represents \$10,000,000 in
silver purchased at prices ranging from 104 to
110. After the passage of the act, quotations
can up as high as 115, but the speculators in
New York slipped so rapidly, that so much
metal was unloaded into this country from Eng-
land, that the market flattened and the con-
gressmen are unable to dispose of the large
quantity they purchased.

Good Shooting.

TACOMA, Oct 20.—R S Mullen of this city
today boldly challenged the magnificent gold
trophy gotten up by subscription among the
richmen of over the coast for the individual
200 yards, off hand military rifle championship.
Today he defeated J M Bell, also of this city,
and the time limit of two years since it was
won expired on the 29 inst. Mr Mullen holds
the beautiful trophy for ever. The shooting
was the best on record in the Northwest. The
steady rain blurred the sights somewhat, but
there was little wind. The scores of both Mr
Mullen and Mr Bell were in excess of those
made by the same gentlemen in the contest
last month and were: Mullen, 392; Bell 355.
R S Palmer was referee. Mr Mullen used his
45-90 Sharpe, with a six-pound pull.
