FAYETTE, Mo., Oct. 23rd, 1890.

I don't know when I will leave here, as I have not seen all of my old friends yet. I will leave for Adrain county to-morrow, where I will visit some of my old neighbors that I have not seen for 20 years, and will visit Ligeon, in old Boone county, and spend a few days there.

There is considerable excitement here about the election. They have the candidates in the field for Congress.

The weather is fine here at this time. Fall sown wheat looks fine. The corn crop is light. Times hard. Pork is worth \$3.80 per hundred gross, and beef about the same.

I spend my time hunting quails and rabbits, and I had a fine success this morning for breakfast. I take breakfast with my youngest sister. She looks well, but is some fifty years old and a little gray like myself.

If I should live to reach Oregon, once more I will stay there the remainder of my days. I like the people here very much, but the climate I don't like. This country looks more broken than it did when I lived here. The land looks badly worn out, but the people are satisfied with the country and live very well. The worst is the negroes, poor, miserable creatures. Some of them I feel sorry for. I met one that my father raised, and she asked me to give her 50 cents. I did so and she said she would keep it as long as she lived to remember me. It made me feel sorry for them, but it isn't my fault. Now I will say that we have the best country in North America that I have ever seen, and when I return I will spend the remainder of my days in old Linn county.

My health is still good, have not been sick one minute since I left home, the 14th of September.

There was a little frost here this morning. The nights are growing cooler.

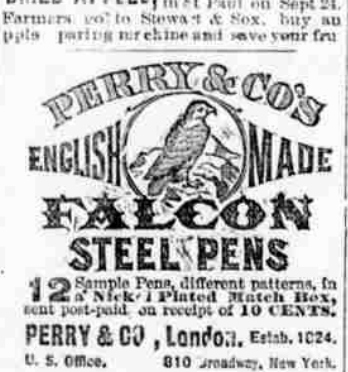

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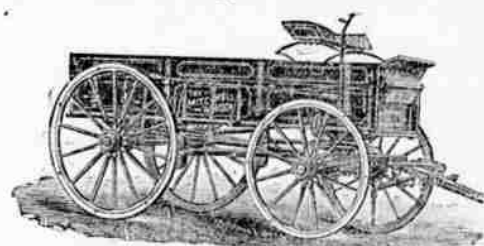
