The congress elected the first of this month will have 332 members of whom (as gress with nothing but a bruised Reed to nearly as the returns now show) 236 are democrats, 90 are republicans, and 5 are Farmer's Alllance. The figures as to the congress of 1874 are taken from the World Almanac of 1876. The figures as to the congress just elected are taken from telegraphic reports published in the Oregonius San Francisco Examiner, New York World Chicago and Philadelphia Times and St-Louis Republic.
