APPORTIONMENT.

The committee to make a congressional apportionment have made their report to congress. The report notes the changes and says from the population of the United States the committee subtracted the population of the District of Columbia, Oklahoma and Utah. The remainder was 61,908,906. With this number different ratios were obtained by taking as a divisor the proposed number of members. Each number was taken from 332 to 375. Trials were made until a number was found which would give the ratio, which in application would secure each state against any loss in membership, and in no instance leave a major fraction. This number was found to be 356. The ratio was 173,951. The number of members obtained on an even division was 339, the additional 17 needed to make 356 was secured by dividing another member of each of the states having left to it a major fraction. Those states are Alabama, California, Georgia, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Oregon, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Texas, Vermont, Virginia and Wisconsin.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Too Much Powder.

ASTORIA, Dec. 12.—Burglars entered the store of Parker & Hanson at 2:30 this morning, and after tapping the till, blew open the safe, but either by mistake or ignorance of the business, they put in an overcharge of powder which made a fearful explosion, heard for several blocks. A huge volume of smoke rolled out through the store, and some excited individual turned in an alarm of fire, and in the attendant excitement the safe blowers escaped. There is a Chinese washhouse in the rear of the store, and the occupants reports seeing two men run away from the place as soon as the explosion occurred. In their haste to get away the burglars left behind to coats, a brace and bit and some other burglar's tools. The force of the explosion blew all the windows out of the office and succeeded in waking the clerk, who was sleeping but a few feet from where the roppers were at work.

A Town Robbed.

WALLA WALLA, Dec. 12.—Last night thieves entered three business establishments at Milton and carried off all the plunder they could carry. From Banks & Queen, general merchandise, they stole four boxes of knives, two cowboy hats, three dozen silk handkerchiefs, several boxes of cigars and all the silk neckties in the store. From the store of L. P. Platts & Co. they took six pairs of gloves, a lot of canned goods, several boxes of shoes, and tried to work the safe but failed. They also entered the butcher shop of H. Harris and helped themselves to Bologna sausage, etc., and tried to open the money drawer, but were unable to do so.

Some Indians Killed.

CHICAGO, Dec. 12.—A special from Pine Ridge, S. D. indicates that the fight between the peace and war factions in Two Strike's was more sanguinary than indicated in the associated dispatches. It says Yankton Gazette, a full-blooded Sioux and government scout came in from the Indian camp in the Bad Lands and reports a bloody fight among the followers of Chiefs Short Bull and Two Strikes. Each claimed the leadership, and each tried to secure it by force. The result is twenty to twenty-five dead Indians. This report is verified by several who have been waiting for some time to escape to agency as spies. They took advantage of the fight to make their escape.

An Engineer's Fault.

WALLA WALLA, Dec. 12.—A collision occurred near Coyote station, seventeen miles west of Umatilla junction, early this morning between two freight trains, the regular west-bound and the first section of the extra. Head brakeman James, of the extra, was instantly killed and Engineer Nichols and Fireman Geise were seriously injured. The accident occurred about 4 o'clock this morning. Railroadmen state that the cause of the accident was the going to sleep of the engineer or too much liquor, as the extra had orders to stop at Coyote to await the passing of the regular passenger and freight, but passed through without stopping.
