THE NEW TARIFF LAW.

Shedd's, Or., Dec 16 1890

Editors Democrat:

One would suppose from reading democratic papers that the McKinley bill makes an increase in the duties on many of the necessities of life and makes no reduction in duties on these articles. Now, I am a republican and a protectionist, and would like to have you name a few articles of necessity upon which duties have been increased.

INQUIRER.

It is only by going into details that the fact whether the McKinley bill increases or decreases duties on the necessities of life may be ascertained. We are glad that "Inquirer" asks for detailed items in the tariff schedule. We mention some items:

On linseed oil the increase is from 25 cents to 32 cents per gallon. This is an increase in the rate from 44% to 53% per cent. On olive oil there is an increase from 25 per cent to 35 cents per gallon which is an increase in rate from 25 per cent to 45 per cent. On varnishes there is an increase of 35 per cent. On lime the increase is from 10 per cent to 35 per cent. On Roman, Portland, and other cements the increase is from 20 to 29 per cent. On boiler iron or steel the increase is from 21 to 33 per cent. On cotton ties (class of hoop iron) the increase is from 35 to 103 per cent. (This class of hoop iron is used by southern planters in baling cotton, hence the great increase.) On tin plates the increase is from 34 to 76 per cent. The increase in zinc in blocks or pig is from 39 to 51 per cent. In fact, to sum up the whole schedule of metals, the increase is from 35 to 51 per cent. Take the schedule of manufactures of wood and there is a slight increase—that is from 18 to 19 per cent. On quite a number of articles of cotton goods there has been an increase—in fact taking all kinds of manufactured cotton goods the increase is from 35 to 38 per cent. There is a slight increase on jute yarn and about 10 per cent increase on jute sacks for grain. Taking all kinds of flax, jute, and shemp manufactures, and the increase is from 33 to 39 per cent. The increase in wool is from 34 to 40 per cent. On woolen and worsted yarns valued at not more than 30 cents per pound the increase is from 70 to 132 per cent. Valued at more than 30 cents and less than 40 cents per pound the duty is increased from 71 to 103 per cent. On woolen cloths, shawls, knit fabrics of all kinds, the duty is increased from 67 to 103 per cent. On blankets, hats of wool, and flannels for underwear, the increase is from 60 to 170 per cent. On ready made clothing the increase is from 54 to 84 per cent. On cloaks, dolmans, jackets, talmas, or other outside garments for ladies and children's apparel, the increase is from 62 to 82 per cent. All cloths and clothing above referred to mean such as are made wholly of or in part of wool, worsted, the hair of the camel, goat, alpaca or other animals except cotton goods named. On webblings, gorings suspenders, dress trimmings, laces, etc., the increase is from 64 to 89 per cent. The average increase on carpet is from 46 to 60 per cent. On silk goods the increase is only from 49 to 51 per cent. On bar, block and pig tin the duty is placed at 4 cents per pound while under the old law it was on the free list. But McKinley did not forget that the people expected him to place many articles on the free list. How well he met their expectations may be seen by referring to the following articles which he placed on the free list. It will be seen that but few are necessities of life. Here are some of them: Acorns, beeswax, books and pamphlets printed in other than the English language, chileory root, dandelion roots, feathers and down, Chinese matting, currants, dates, greece, human hair, opium unmanufactured, hemp and rape seeds, sponges, sand, tobacco stems etc. We trust our friend will be able to see from this partial list of articles upon which the duties have been increased, that democratic papers have made no mistake in warning the people against the outrages of the McKinley bill.

The rates of percentage given above are approximately exact, many of them being fractional, the fractional part being dropped.

Advices from Liverpool say that stocks of wheat in first hands in the United Kingdom are expected to steadily decrease, and at the end of the year to be smaller than at any corresponding time since 1881, when they were 1,350,000 quarters.
