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TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

A Sound Cyclone.
SEATTLE, Dec. 25.—This city was struck by a terrific cyclone early this morning which continued with gradually diminishing fury until evening. The wind was heralded by steady down pour of rain which set in about dusk on Wednesday and continued into this morning. At 2:30 A. M. strong gusts of wind began to blow and by 3 o'clock the wind rose to the dignity of a gale. It blew with increasing fury until about 5 o'clock; it was shaking every house, wrecking many and lashing the sound into foam; tearing vessels from their anchorage and dashing them against one another; like lifts of driftwood, laying low giant trees and appearing to threaten to sweep all before it.

State Assessment.
SALEM, Dec. 25.—With one exception— that of Multnomah county—the assessment rolls of all the counties of the state have been returned to the secretary of state. Of thirty-one counties, sixteen show an increase in the total assessment for 1890 over that of 1889, and the remaining fifteen returned decreased amounts. Estimating Multnomah at \$40,000,000, the total taxable property for the state is \$114,682,263, as against \$101,593,341 last year. It is estimated that the levy for state purposes will be 4 1/2 mills. Last year it was 5 23/25 mills.

Eastern Storms.
WASHINGTON, Dec. 25.—A special bulletin issued by the signal office, referring to the present storm, which extends from Indiana to Virginia, promises the greatest amount of snow in any single storm for several years. Warnings were sent railroads in Pennsylvania and New York today, and the storm will reach New England by Friday. From three to seven inches of snow fell today in the Ohio valley.

More Indian News.
OMAHA, Dec. 25.—A special from Pine Ridge says the Indians in Bad Lands are still in council. Couriers came in today with the news that Short Bull said that if the government will agree not to disarm his men, nor take their ponies he will come in. The Indians holding out fear they are to be given oxen instead of ponies.

Only a Hairpin.
NEW YORK, Dec. 25.—A peculiar and fatal accident occurred on Eleventh street. An elderly woman fell to the sidewalk, and when picked up she was found to be dead. An examination disclosed the fact that a hairpin had been driven into her brain when her head struck the sidewalk.

The Deadly Wire.
TACOMA, Dec. 25.—Early this morning, while a news carrier was making his rounds on Sixth street, his horse stepped on a broken electric wire and was killed by the shock. The carrier, Walter Boardman, was unconscious for a short time, but subsequently was able to make his route on foot.
