THINGS WORTH REMEMBERING.
Small pieces of ice taken in the mouth will often allay vomiting and quench thirst. Sock the feet, and bind on baking soda dampened, and in the morning you will be surprised to find the soreness all out of you. When any one runs a nail or wire in their flesh, hold the wound over burning sugar as soon as possible and it will prevent soreness. Procure from your druggist a small bottle of Tincture of benzoin and apply to any fish wound; it will heal immediately and not get sore. If any one washes their finger or toe nail with a pen knife immediately after it is hurt and the throbbing will be checked at once. When children have taken cold there is nothing better to give them than molasses, butter and vinegar; to half cup of molasses take a tablespoonful of butter and two tablespoonfuls of vinegar; cook a few minutes and give a little frequently. Quite young children can take this.

A Peculiar Bill.
WASHINGTON, Jan. 7.—A unique measure was introduced today in the senate, in the shape of a bill by Senator Teller, at the request of some colored people's association in this city. It directs the secretary of the treasury to pay to certain persons to be named hereafter \$50,000,000 of land in Lower California for permanent settlement by colored people of United States who wish to establish a colored colony there, the money to be returned to the government with interest in forty years.
