A bill is to be introduced in the Michigan legislature providing for the election of presidential electors by congressional districts.

As has been the custom in the Oregon legislature for the last twenty years a bill has been introduced to create the office of precinct assessor. But it ought to pass.

The three farmer's alliance men in the Illinois legislature have agreed to support A. J. Streeter for the United States Senate. Streeter is an old greenbacker and a chronic political malcontent.

Story of Multnomah has introduced a bill providing that the city of Portland may issue bonds to the amount of \$2,500,000 not exempt from taxation to secure Bull Run water. Now let the bill be put through both houses on the "Bully" run.

Senator Myers has introduced a bill appropriating \$3000 to improve the Soda Springs at Sodalville in this county. We are informed that the grounds have been dedicated to the public and the proposition is to make a public park and beautify it. The bill ought to pass.

Already many bills have been introduced making appropriations for wagon roads. The amount called for by those bills is about \$106,000. There are some more to come yet. Then also a number of other "raid" bills to be introduced soon. The people of the commonwealth should keep a vigilant eye on the movements of the vultures.

Senator George having charged and Senator Hawley admitted that Hartford, with 12,000 votes, sends two representatives to the Connecticut legislature, and Hartland, in the same county, with 200 votes, also sends two, it looks as if there was a great deal of suppression in a system which allows such procedures, though Senator Hawley says he does "not know anything fairer or more democratic."

Few public men in America, endowed with qualities of Mr. Edmunds, have accomplished so little. A lawyer whose elevation to the bench would have been heartily approved by his most determined political opponents, he consents at this time, in deliberating upon the course of senatorial debate, to receive instructions from Chandler and Hoar, and to use his abilities as a controversialist to find reason, rule or precedent to justify a partisan majority in its attempt to carry through congress an obnoxious measure emphatically condemned by the people at the polls.

### RETURNING REASON.

E. W. Burdett, of Massachusetts, leader of the Crapo forces in 1889, in a talk with a Boston Post reporter about Mr. Crapo's possible candidacy next year and the needs of the republican party in Massachusetts, says: "My admiration for the character and capacity of Mr. Crapo is as great as ever, and, of course, his nomination would give me much personal satisfaction; but whether he will be a candidate I cannot say. He certainly will not enter a struggle for the nomination. But, after all, the question of candidates is of less importance than the adoption of certain changes in principles and methods. I believe that the republican party must make a new departure. While loyal to the party, I am not satisfied with present conditions and want to see some changes within the party. The recent election unmistakably indicated a deep-seated dissatisfaction on the part of nearly 50,000 republicans of Massachusetts, and at the same time a reluctance on their part to go over to the democratic party. Unpleasant as such a prospect is from a party standpoint, I fear that the next year or two will find a majority of these dissatisfied voters on the other side, unless a new departure is taken by the republican party. The democratic leaders recognize and rejoice in this prospect, and openly boast, not without reason, that if things continue to go as they have lately, Massachusetts may take its position permanently in the democratic column."
