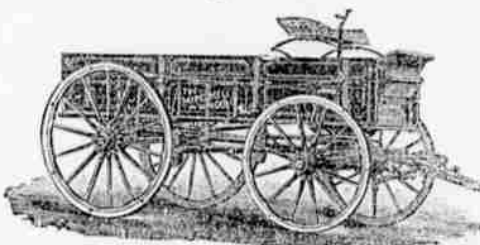

TEMPERANCE COLUMN.

Edited by Albany W. C. T. U.

Six different mission stations in Burmah
are circulating Neal Dow's tracts on
smoking.

Mrs. Case, of the Baptist mission at My-
ingyan, has formed temperance and puri-
ty league, both among the Burman pupils
of her school and the English soldiers
stationed there.

At a temperance meeting lately held in
Rangoon, Burmah, where but fifty natives
were present, seventeen signed the pledge.
The speech, made in English, was trans-
lated into Tamil, Telugu, and Hindustani.

Miss Frances Willard says: "In the
good time coming, the daily paper will lie
upon our tables, the transcript of the best
doings of humanity." "Meanwhile," says
Rev. Florence Kollock, "let the daily paper
fearlessly and faithfully tell the worst,
that we may know with what we have to
deal, and rise to the duties which the
knowledge puts upon us."

The W. C. T. U. of St. Johns, Newfound-
land, organized three months ago, has
since doubled its membership. It lately
held a public meeting and sustained the
interest of the audience to the end of a
program two hours in length. The
largest hall in the city, seating over one
thousand persons, was packed.

"Naturalists tell us," says Frances Will-
ard, "that walking is a succession of in-
terrupted falls forward. So civilization
may be termed the forward falls of na-
tions interrupted just in the nick of time."

The Indiana Friends have put them-
selves on record as no friends of the sa-
loon. Here is their sentiment: "On
purely secular matters Christians may
safely be indifferent, but as between sin
and righteousness, drunkenness and sobri-

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

A Dirty Wash

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—It is stated on
apparently good authority that Mr. Hoar
has in his pocket a letter written to him by
Speaker Barrett, of the Massachusetts
house of representatives, containing the
information that a canvass of the members
of the legislature shows that a large ma-
jority believe that the action of the senate
on Monday in shelving the gag rule and
force bill was wise and politic. Senator
Hoar, therefore, is said to have reached
the determination that as these constitu-
ants speak with no uncertain voice he is
justified in washing his hands of the ob-
noxious bill from this time forth.

More Suits.

SALEM, Jan. 28.—Today papers in six more
damage suits against the Southern Pacific
Company, were filed with the clerk of the cir-
cuit court of Marion county, making the total
number of cases already filed an even dozen.
The aggregate amount of damages asked in the
suits last instituted is \$86,275, and of the twelve
\$184,225. Every one of these cases has
grown out of the train wreck at Lake Lapiash
last November. The suits filed and the dam-
ages asked in filings were made today as fol-
lows: G. E. Miller, \$25,175; John Pengilly,
\$8,000; Jane Clark, \$20,100; E. W. Sprout, \$10,
000; Lottie Magnuson, \$25,000; Minnie Mag-
nuson, \$8,000.

A Death Struggle.

TACOMA, Jan. 28.—Last night Daniel Web-
ster, Harry Roberts and Alie Laughlin, Pay
allup Indians, all aged about 25, came to
town from the reservation and filled up on bad
whisky. On the way to the reservation after
dark Laughlin was so drunk he could not sit
up, but remembers that the others quarreled,
got out in the road and fought and that the
horses ran away with him. This morning the
body of Webster was found dead by the side
of the road. There were evidences of a strug-
gle, Webster's tongue being out. He evidently
had been choked to death by the tight-
ening of the handkerchief worn about his neck.

Worse Than First Reported.

PITTSBURGH, Jan. 28.—H. C. Frick, of the
Mammoth mine No. 1, the scene of yester-
day's terrible explosion, has been in al-
most constant communication with rep-
resentatives at the pit since yesterday.
Frick says in all there were 160 men
working in the mine at the time of the
accident; that nine escaped with their lives,
some of them badly injured. The rest, 151
men, were either killed outright or suffo-
cated by the terrible afterdamp.

Gladstone's Position.

LONDON, Jan. 28.—Current reports in
regard to Gladstone's intended resignation
are associated in the public mind with ne-
gotiations for the settlement of the Irish
difficulties. It is intimated that as Par-
nell is evidently not going to obliterate
himself, Gladstone, who has virtually de-
manded Parnell's withdrawal, now pro-
poses to get out of the dilemma by him-
self.

Vilas Elected.

MADISON, Wis., Jan. 28.—Colonel Vilas
was formally elected by the joint convention
of the legislature today to succeed United
States Senator Spooner.
