FOR CLEVELAND IN 1892.

The action of the democrats of the New York legislature in nominating Gov. Hill for the senate simplifies matters somewhat, as it was imagined by some that the governor was a dangerous rival to ex-President Cleveland for the presidential nomination next year. The few democrats who are opposed to Mr Cleveland had nearly all pinned their hopes upon Gov. Hill, who is known to be an able politician and withal a very ambitious one. For weeks it has been proclaimed by them that he would not accept the senatorial nomination, but that he would keep himself in readiness for the presidential contest. His unanimous nomination for senator dispels all those hopes and shows that the democrats of the Empire state will go into the contest of 1892 united and to win.

The democrats of the New York legislature have just enough votes to elect the senator while the republicans are two votes short of the required number. Gov. Hill will be the next New York senator, and next year he will be one of the foremost supporters of Grover Cleveland as the candidate for the great democratic party for president.

Little by little the political sky is clearing and there is nothing more certain than that Grover Cleveland will be nominated by the democratic convention without serious opposition and triumphantly elected.—Milwaukee Journal.

A GERRYMANDERED STATE.

The Connecticut legislature Wednesday re-elected Senator Platt, who now represents the state in the senate in the republican interest. His majority was small, but sufficient.

Mr Platt will represent the majority in the legislature but not the majority of the people of Connecticut. The legislature itself does not represent that majority. The democratic members in the two branches represent 95,840 votes while the republican members represent only 73,144 votes, yet the republicans have a majority in the legislature and have elected a republican to misrepresent the state in the United States senate.

The composition of the legislature of Connecticut and New York, in comparison with the votes represented by the democratic and republican members respectively, should make republicans blush every time they use the word "gerrymander."

The Oregonian, in reply to our question as to the means by which Senator Mitchell won it over to his support says the senator has not "placated" it. It sets up its old hackneyed corollary: that the democrats helped elect Mitchell. It should not forget that those democrats who voted for Mitchell gave as their reason that they simply chose between two evils. It was much better to have him than some old evil-spirited Bourbon like Hoar or Edmunds. But at this last senatorial election there was no purpose to give Mitchell a single democratic vote. This the Oregonian and other "opposition" to Mitchell knew full well. If Mitchell's opponents in the republican party have always been able to defeat him when democrats kept their hands off, as that paper alleges, why did not that "opposition" defeat him this time? The truth is the opposition to Mitchell in that party is a mere fabric of a vision. The fact may be stated that Mitchell is as complete a boss of his party in that state as Joe Simon is in his way. The statement of that paper that "the people of Oregon care nothing for moral or immoral character," has no proof at all except it be in the late election of Mitchell to the senate.
