The statement of the *Herald* that "a good many of those opposed to the proposed division of Linn county say they would rather lose the Albany bridge than to see the county divided," is so manifestly absurd and false that it hardly calls for correction. The basis of the plan to secure division was laid in opposition to building a bridge. The call for a bridge at Albany was given as a reason why there should be division. It further says: "If those of Albany who do not want a bridge will now just work hard enough to keep this opposition, (the Forks,) in the county, they may succeed in stopping the county appropriation for the bridge and thereby down the whole bridge question." No, it is known of all men in Albany that those two or three men in the city who oppose the building of a bridge most are in favor of a division. It is difficult to labor to secure an ulterior object without resorting to subterfuge and misrepresentation.

HINTS TO HOUSEKEEPERS.

Use a clam shell to scrape pots and frying-pans with.

To restore strong ham to its original freshness, slice and soak over night in milk, either sweet or sour.

When wiping up the floor before putting the carpet down, sprinkle it all over with salt while damp; this will greatly prevent moths.

When cold water is craved, (although cold water really interferes with digestion,) it should be boiled and filtered and cooled in bottles on ice.

The best way to cook Finnan haddie is to put on a boiler for ten minutes over a quick fire, and then put in boiling water five minutes.

In purchasing canned goods it is a safe rule to observe whether the head of the can is concave, a bulging appearance being indicative of decomposition.

A man's way of patching a hole in a table-cloth would probably be to sew on a piece; a woman's way is to patch the piece on with starch and then smooth it with a hot iron.

If the throat is very sore, wring a cloth out of cold salt and water, and bind it on the throat tightly, when going to bed; cover it with a dry towel. This is excellent.

Lard is sometimes adulterated with alum, starch and lime water. When pure, it is completely soluble in benzine, has no burnt taste or odor and melts without sputtering to a clear fluid.

The best way to preserve old boots is never to use blacking of any sort, but have the boots brushed, or if very muddy, wiped with a damp cloth or sponge, then carefully gone over with a little dubbing.

For stiff neck, sore throat, pains in the chest, a good remedy is to rub some oil or vaseline into the skin, then cover with a piece of cotton wadding, the shiny side outward, and wear till the discomfort is gone.

To keep flour from spoiling, it should be thoroughly dried and stored in bags, not in barrels. It is said that the exclusion of air is apt to render flour somewhat damp, and does not yield as good a dough as when the flour remains perfectly dry.

For a felon, take common rock-salt such as is used for salting down pork, dry it in an oven, then pound it fine and mix with spirits of turpentine in equal parts. Put it on a linen rag and wrap around the felon. As it dries put on more, and if followed up the felon will be dead in twenty-four hours.

Gold tinsel ruckling will be of great assistance to those who have to depend on their own fingers for the manipulation of *bombonieres* to send to their friends. It is bright looking, and easily used in ornamenting bags, baskets, flower tubes covered with brocade, plush, and so forth. The rose and chrysanthemum petal rucklings, too, are useful, for they save all the trouble of sewing on each petal separately.

Prime wheat flour should have the following characteristics: When handled none should adhere to the finger; if a handful be squeezed, it should not sift through the fingers, but should clog together, forming a little ball, which will show the fine lines of the palm for some time after release; if a little ball of flour be dropped on a table, it should even then preserve its form and continuity, at least in large measure.

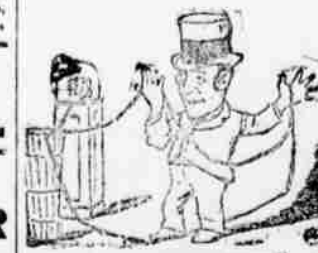
