The Oregonian speaking of the tariff duties placed on imported foreign goods for the purpose of protecting home manufacturers, says: "The object of such duty is undoubtedly to keep out the foreign article, or to compel it, if imported, to carry a higher price, so that the domestic product may be sold on advantageous terms." Of course that is the object, but the Oregonian might have made the whole matter plainer by saying that the duty is levied in order that the domestic product may be sold for a higher price than could be obtained had not the duty been imposed. One thing is true, if the placing of a duty on an article does not enable home manufacturers to sell it at a more advantageous price than without the duty, the law would be of no benefit to the manufacturers. McKinley himself takes no question about the matter. He boldly proclaims that it will make goods dearer and sneeringly says that a "cheap coat makes a cheap man" and that cheap goods are "nasty" goods and that they cheapen cheap goods etc. Notwithstanding this unabashed avowal of McKinley's adhesion to the interests of the few against the interests of the many, republican protection organs all over the country are declaring that the tariff does not increase the price of goods. If a man wants to find out whether it does or not he could get no better proof than the circulars sent out to business men and dealers all over the country from manufacturers and wholesale dealers giving notice of an advance in consequence of the passage of the McKinley bill.

## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

**An English Storm.**  
LONDON March 12.—England is bound up in a severe frost, which greatly hinders the work of clearing the railway tracks. Enormous masses of snow drifted upon them during the recent violent storms. All efforts to reopen communication with Cornwall is thus far unavailing and the country continues isolated from the rest of England. Many wrecks occurred at Landsend and along the Cornish coast generally. A great number of persons were drowned and frozen to death.

**A Libel Suit**  
SEATTLE, Wash, March 12.—A complaint was filed today in the superior court by G. Krueger against the San Publishing & Printing Company for libel and \$15,000 damages. The case arises out of some articles which appeared in the Sun intimating that a certain real estate agent had been run down by a United States detective and made to disgorge \$1500 which was obtained in Wisconsin some years ago under peculiar circumstances. Krueger applied the insinuation to himself, hence the suit. The Sun has also been fighting disreputable land agents of late, which Krueger has also taken exception to.

**The First Train.**  
SEATTLE, March 12.—The first train passed over the Lake Shore & Eastern from Seattle to the British boundary line today, carrying a party of Lake Shore officials. The party consisted of:  
A. S. Danham, president; F. W. Dann, superintendent; R. H. Talcott, chief engineer of the construction company, and George W. Catt, manager of the San Francisco Bridge Company.

A telegram received tonight announces the arrival of the party at Sumas, at the boundary line. The road will be opened for traffic north of Sedro in a few days.

**Deep Snow.**  
DENVER March 12.—The snow blockade on the Midland road, near Ivanho, where the passenger train has been under snow, was raised today. Silverton and Telluride are still snowed under, the drifts in many places being forty feet high. Provisions are carried into these towns on snowshoes, and all hopes of railway communication with them inside of a month is abandoned.

**A Battle Reported.**  
BUENOS AYRES, March 12.—Chilian news is to the effect that there has been further fighting between the government troops and the revolutionists and the latter were victorious. A report is current that the republic of Uruguay has tendered its friendly offices to the contending factions.

**Wound to be Poor in Oregon.**  
BALTIMORE, Md., March 12.—President Harrison today bagged thirteen bucks, one of which was a canvasback weighing three and one-half pounds. It was the first and only canvasback shot at Bengles, Md., this season. General Sewell and E. C. Knight, together, brought down twelve ducks.
