**TELEGRAPHIC NEWS**

**Parrell Hooded.**  
DUBLIN, March 26.—The annoyances and  
dangers of Mr. Parrell's tour of the Sligo parlia-  
mentary district are increasing, groups of the  
opposing faction hoot at him at every turn, and  
wrangles and fights growing out of these dem-  
onstrations are frequent. The greater part of  
the anti-Parrell feeling is incited by the priest-  
hood, who are especially active in the out-  
lying districts, and personally led the opposing  
crowds. It was the intention of Mr. Parrell to  
enter Sligo Saturday at the head of a strong  
party of stalwart Parrellites, but the police  
plainly intimated that this would not be allowed,  
and the project was abandoned.

**The worst Blow on Record.**  
NEW YORK, March 26.—Frank P. Slavin  
has authorized Billy Madden to match him to  
fight, or box, any man in America for any  
amount from \$2,500 to \$10,000 a side, and the  
championship of the world. He also requests  
Madden to announce that he will give John L.  
Sullivan \$5000 if he fails to stop, conquer or  
knock him out in six rounds. He also agrees to  
box either Kilrain, Corbett, Jackson, Mc-  
Caffrey or Godfrey, and to forfeit a large  
amount of money if he fails to stop any one of  
them in a stipulated number of rounds. Slavin  
will arrive here next month with Charley  
Mitchell, and will deposit \$5000 to back up  
the foregoing proposition. His coming is  
likely to create a future in sporting circles.

**Two Brave Boys.**  
OREGON CITY, Or., March 26.—Two  
Oregon boys have occasions to feel  
proud as they have just been presented by  
W. W. Quinn with a gold medal each for  
saving the life of William H. Quinn. Mr.  
Quinn fell into the Willamette at the  
head of the falls while carrying a line to  
the Enterprise, when she foundered on the  
reefs at the falls two months ago. The  
medals are alike, except that each contains  
the name of the party to whom it was pre-  
sented.

**Has Everything.**  
TACOMA, March 26.—During the trial of  
Gerich Baratto and Frank Leo, yesterday,  
several young men, called as witnesses, refused  
to testify until a crowd of fifty or more Italians  
were removed. They gave the reason that  
they were afraid to testify in their presence.  
Baratto was discharged of a charge of assault  
with a deadly weapon. This, it is alleged,  
was caused by the existence of a Mafia society  
here.

TACOMA, March 26.—In the Payallup saw-  
mill today a workman named Ernest Foster  
caught the sleeve of his shirt in the teeth of a  
saw and was drawn upon it. His neck came  
in contact with the rapidly revolving circular  
saw and his head was cut completely from his  
body. The deceased came here a few days  
ago from Iowa, and leaves a widow and a  
family.
