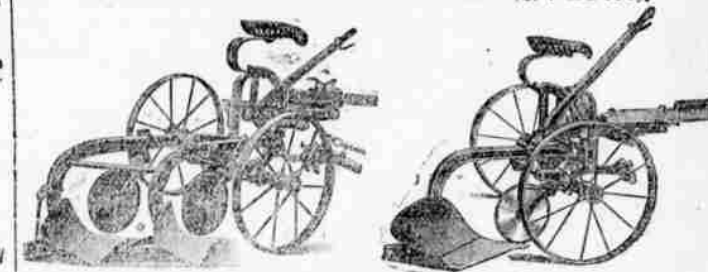

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

The Chicago Election.

Chicago, April 7.—At midnight 450 pro-
cincts out of 513 gave Creiger 38,957, Har-
ison 36,603, Hempstead Washburne 41,735,
Elmer Washburne 30,754, Morgan 1781.
At 2 A M C mproller Osahan said all the
precincts had been heard from, and that the
complete returns gave Creiger 423 plurality
over Washburne. The great gain for Creiger
was in the stock yards district, where a large
body of Irish-Americans seemed to have
stuck to the regular ticket. The official
count will probably be necessary to decide the
matter. The City Press Association, which
is gathering the returns for the papers, an-
nounced that the city hall people had made
a mistake early in the night of 1855 votes
in their footing, and that the error was con-
tinued through the night. According to the
city press Headquarters Washburne still has a
plurality of 1861.

The Parnell Sensation.

LONDON, April 7.—The relations of Par-
nell to Mrs O'Shea have been rendered more
mysterious than ever by recent reports. No
declaration was made by Parnell himself,
nor by any person authorized to speak for
either person concerned, that he was to be
married when the divorce was made abso-
lute. That period is now at hand, and
friends of both are anxious the ambiguous
situation should be cleared up. Stories,
with more or less foundation, culminated in
a report yesterday that a marriage with Mrs
O'Shea would not take place, as Parnell was
already married to another lady.

Eugene Election.

EGGERS, April 7.—The result of the city
of yesterday is as follows. Mayor J H Mc-
Clung; recorder, B F Dorris; treasurer,
George F. Craw; councilmen G B Dorris, J J
Walton and J L Page. The newly-elected
officers are all well fitted for the places and
no serious objections have been raised to any
of them. McClung has served several terms
in the council. Mr Dorris has filled his
office several terms. The others are mostly
new men.

Will Investigate It.

WASHINGTON, April 7.—There is reason
to believe that the government has decided
to go to the bottom of the New Orleans af-
fair, and with that end in view, has sent to
that city a number of the best trained de-
tectives in its employ, who are to act in con-
nection with the United States attorney
there and report to him. Two whole matter
is to be carefully investigated.

Edmonds Out.

WASHINGTON, April 7.—Senator George
F Edmonds, of Vermont, who has been in
the United States senate since April, 1866,
and has nearly if not quite all that time been
one of the republican leaders, has resigned,
to take effect the 1st of November next.
