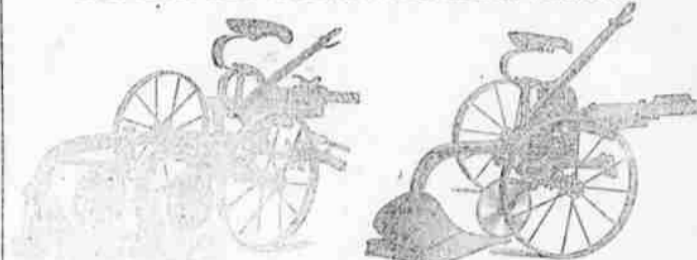

## TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

A Chicago Fire.

CHICAGO, April 12.—Chicago this evening  
suffered one of the most destructive conflagra-  
tions that has occurred here since the big fire  
of 1871. The loss is fully \$1,000,000. It was  
at almost the geographical center of the city  
that the flames started, and like the terrible  
disaster of twenty years ago, began in a stable.  
The losses were about as follows:

A South American War.

NEW YORK, April 12.—The New York  
World's special correspondent at Buenos Ayres  
says: "The revolution in Chili now amounts to  
a civil war. Rapine, violence, confiscations,  
arbitrary arrests, complete overturning of the  
laws, treachery, and everything else almost  
that is bad, prevail. Trade is nearly at a  
standstill, and the supreme court and court of  
appeals are closed, as the judges found them-  
selves without authority. President Balmaceda  
has assumed functions which the czar of  
Russia would hesitate to grasp. The actual  
situation, from a purely military standpoint, is  
difficult to comprehend.

Getting Ready

ST. PETERSBURG, April 12.—The czar has  
renamed most of the regiments of the Russian  
army after the commanders and generals nota-  
ble since the time of Peter the Great, and the  
reserve battalions after the important victories  
gained by Russian arms. Ten of these battal-  
ions are raised to full regiments, 20,000 being  
thus added to the reserves. With the recent  
decrees for the construction of military roads  
and a large increase in the fleet, everything  
points to an unremitting increase of the defen-  
sive forces of the empire.

Max Pracht Out

WASHINGTON, April 12.—Max Pracht has  
lost his position as collector of customs for the  
Alaska district, and Edward T. Hatch of Mc-  
Coy, Polk county, Oregon, a state senator and  
a well known politician, is appointed in his  
place. This removal, although contemplated for  
some time, has been kept quiet because the  
Oregon congressmen wanted to secure the vacan-  
cy for their own state.

Lost \$50,000,000

PARIS, April 12.—Baron Gustave Roth-  
schild has returned from Algeria in precarious  
health. It is stated in recent years he has lost  
200,000,000 francs in speculation. He still  
has a large fortune. He has retired from the  
bank with which he has been connected, of  
his own accord.

A Fatal Accident

SIERRA CITY, Cal April 12.—A fatal gun-  
ning accident happened here this afternoon,  
whereby Charles Nelson lost his life. A  
number of boys were hunting in a brush,  
Loui Fischer was leaning with his gun on his  
shoulder, when from some unknown cause the  
weapon was discharged, the lead tearing a  
frightful hole in little Nelson's side.
